#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

#### Capers,

First and foremost, this March represent the 60<sup>th</sup> Year Anniversary of the publication known as the Caper. It was first published in March 1955, by the Board of Governors (BOG), after its approval in the January 1955 BOG meeting. It was an eight page publication filled with articles from the BOG meeting, Women's Club, Society Notes, Skating on Lake Claire & Deep Creek due to the extended two week freeze, an upcoming Spring Dance of 1955 and ads from all over Annapolis area, as there were not many businesses on the Broadneck Peninsula or in Cape St. Claire at the time. A few ads of interest I thought should be highlighted would be Mr. and Mrs. C.G Smith and their Tasty Freeze store along Revell Highway, what is just known as Rt. 50 today, at the entrance of Cape St. Claire. Mr. Smith and his family still owns and operates Bella's Liquors in the shopping center to this day. There were a few other noteworthy ads from Fawcett's in downtown Annapolis and Bert Spriggs Lincoln and Mercury Dealer which still operates in Annapolis today. The grand opening announcement of Harpe's Store which was to open before May 1<sup>st</sup>, 1955 in the Cape Shopping Center, a store that would provide Medicines, Sodas and Sundries while providing air conditioning. Well, fast forward 60 years to 2015, "old man" winter struck with vengeance in February. Our first real accumulation of snow, a week of record breaking low temperatures, some breaking century old or more records. A frozen Lake Claire where kids and adults gathered to play pond hockey. Deep Creek, the Little Magothy and Magothy River frozen out as far as you could see. A unique view of the Bay could be had by standing on the snow lined Main Beach, you could see the Coast Guard Ice Cutter Ship clearing the Chesapeake Bay Channel for cargo ships headed to and from Baltimore. With that recap of the February in our review mirror, we can now look forward to spring which is just over the horizon.

Spring breathes life back into Cape St. Claire and our calendars begin to be consumed with activities in the community, schools and sports to name few. The Annual Easter Egg Hunt on the Main Beach will be held on March 28th, look for work days to begin again around the CSC properties, a kick off the spring bon-fire at the Main Beach, likely in early April, details to follow via CSCIA Facebook Page. #### BOARD IN BRIEF

February 9, 2015 - President Breeden called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. He said it's been a busy month but things are running smoothly in the office.

The minutes of the Board of Governors' meetings of December 8, 2014 and January 13, 2015 were approved.

The final Profit and Loss statements of November 30, and December 31, 2014 were approved.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**Covenants:** Governor Snow mentioned several items that he and Governor Breeden have been working on. He will be updating all of the files soon.

**Caper:** Governor Lamb is still looking for timely submissions. She got a lot of positive feedback regarding the color issue last month and is planning a special  $60^{th}$  anniversary issue.

**Clubhouse:** Governor Lamb said rentals have been steady and that there were some recent sewer line issues which have been addressed.

**Strawberry Festival Committee:** Governor Lamb commented that the next event is the Easter Egg Hunt (March 28<sup>th</sup>) and then the Strawberry Festival on June 6th.

**Signboard:** Governor Lamb has some issues to discuss in new business.

**Treasurer:** Governor Myers said things are on track.

**Events:** Governor Myers said work is beginning on the July 4<sup>th</sup> events, and there may be an April bonfire on the beach.

**Erosion:** Governor Vaccaro has turned in the phragmites burn permit, and needs to schedule a burn and restoration planting. She has an item to bring up in new business.

**Communication and Technology:** Governor Szczytko reported that the office has been rearranged and centralized, email has been moved to <a href="mailto:office@cscia.org">office@cscia.org</a> and the first edition of the Caper is now on line. The website has a new more responsive host and there is now a web form for reserving the signboard.

**Piers:** Governor Small said all pending slips have been updated to the wait list, which is being cleaned up, along with the move list. Contracts are coming in and there should be 15 to 20 additional slips available this year.

**Beaches and Parks:** Governor Breeden said there are about 80 to 100 hours of community service looking for projects.

**Building:** Governor Breeden said there is nothing new in the way of variances and several permits have been granted.

**Security:** Governor Breeden said that January has been quiet other than several break-ins in the area. The Neighborhood Watch will soon have a new web page.

**BLOA:** Governor Breeden said there was a meeting to further discuss financing for the water at the shopping center.

**BCC:** Governor Breeden said there will be a meeting Thursday night at 7:30 at the Clubhouse with Councilman Peroutka.

**Personnel:** Governor Breeden is working with Leslie on personnel matters.

**Mosquito Control:** The form is due by March 1.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Governor Myers noted that a bill before the County Council limiting SCDBs died before a vote.

It was noted that Sarah Gannon is the new constituent services person.

There was discussion of the signboard and its future style, location, and financing of that. Governor Lamb moved that money collected to date from the signboard be transferred to the Events Committee. The motion passed unanimously. Governor Lamb will continue to take information and the sign will now be changed by the Maintenance crew.

Regarding a private well that sits on Cape property, nothing has been returned from the landowner but an agreement is pending. An agreement is also in the works regarding a structure built onto Cape property. The County is now looking into a private business on a property that has been the subject of numerous complaints.

Governor Vaccaro said that a watershed steward candidate wants to create a rain garden at the Clubhouse. Grants would pay for its installation and the CSCIA would be eligible for tax credits. A motion was made and passed that this be allowed.

Governors Breeden and Lamb discussed the removal of the light poles right outside the Clubhouse, at the corner of Riverbay and St. Catherines, and on the Main Beach. The plan is to install more attractive decorative lighting.

There was discussion of street lights and their installation throughout the Cape.

Mike Buchet pointed out that the Budget Committee still needs a third member.

There was some discussion of future online finances, payments and receipts.


The meeting was adjourned at 8:29 P.M.


#### **MEMBERS PRESENT:**



#### GOSHEN FARM PRESERVATION SOCIETY

#### NEWS FROM GOSHEN FARM - MARYLAND DAY/OPEN HOUSE

We have an insert in this issue of the Caper regarding our participation in the Maryland Day in the Four Rivers Heritage Area. We are combining it with our Spring Open House and hope that everyone in the Cape will come out and support our efforts to save the historic Goshen Farm and its surrounding 22 acres of pristine land. It should be a fun time for the entire family.

In preparation for our Maryland Day/Open House celebration and in honor of Black History Month we thought we would share some of the research we have discovered to date.

Edward Stewart was born about 1832 in Maryland according to the Anne Arundel County Court, Chattel Records, 1845-1851, Volume 818, p.424. Thomas J. Hall conveyed Edward Stewart to Landy Linstead on September 8, 1850 according to state records. The papers conveying Mr. Stewart required that he would "remain in servitude until he shall have arrived at the age of thirty eight years he being at the date of this instrument about sixteen years and six months old."



Thomas J. Hall inherited Goshen Farm and its slaves and property from Richard Gardiner and lost it to debt after about 2 years. The 1870 Census for AA County District 3 shows Edward Stewart, born about 1832, still living in the area. He had a wife, Martha, age 40, and 4 children, Hester age 12, Lemuel age 10, Jacob age 6, and Rebecca age 4. It is very likely that this Edward Stewart is the same person who was conveyed to Landy Linstead. We found no further mention of Mr. Stewart in our research but we did find a Lemuel Stewart appearing in the 1880 census as a farm worker living with an Ellison family in District 3. By then, many freed slave were working in the growing farm area on the Broadneck.

Of interest in our research, a George Gardiner (b.1839) is on the 1860 census as living with Philip Pettebone who was the executor of Richard Gardiners will and a relative. The Gardiners and Pettebones were connected through marriage for 3 generations. Many of the old timers in the Cape remember picking those wonderful strawberries at the Pettebone farm off of Bay Head Road. It is possible that George Gardiner may have been a slave of Richard Gardiner at one time, or possibly the child of Gardiner slaves. We base this supposition mainly on the names and closeness of the 2 families.

We also located the following manumission record:

Cornelia Tydings manumitted by Henry Tydings by deed bearing the date "twenty third February eighteen hundred and forty eight aged twenty one years of very light complexion height five feet six inches." His Certificate of freedom issued October 23rd A. D. 1851. This occurred prior to Henry Tydings owning Goshen. We found that a Henry Tydings is buried in the Stinchcomb-Tydings Family Cemetery and he fought in the Confederate States Army (CSA). Stay tuned as we do further research.

We have just begun our research into the families that have resided at Goshen Farm or have lived on the Broadneck and have ties to Goshen Farm. In the future we will use this space to share the farms fascination history.



A committee appointed for the purpose of investigating the possibility of producing the paper and composed of four members of the Board, President Graham Goodell, Harry C. Kirsch, Frank C. Christhilf and Albert C. Dansereau, recommended that the paper should be published.

Clay Davis, Club Treasurer, made the motion that the recommendation of the committee be put into effect. It was seconded by John Walsh and passed without a dissenting vote.

The idea of sending a regular monthly newspaper to the members was introduced by Mr. Dansereau at the November meeting of the Board. The fact that most other large and important organizations use a similar type medium to keep (Cont. on Page 4)

WHY HAVE PROPERTY RESTRICTIONS

The legal rules by which are bound in the deed to our property at Cape St. Claire are known as Restrictions. In reality these rules, like other rules or laws which govern our conduct, are for our own good as well as the good of other members of our community.

If there were no restrictions on the types of buildings which may be legally erected at Cape St. Claire, you probably would not want to own property here, as its value would depend a great deal upon what kind of structures your neighbors put up. Obviously, if your property were surrounded by shacks you would not want to build a nice home for your family in such a location.






