President's Perspective

Cape St. Claire Security Club

An effort to create a CSC Security Club is underway. The purpose of the club is to support the current security efforts already established by the CSCIA, which pays a off-duty police officers to patrol the community. The establishment of this club is going to be grassroots, which means it will only be as effective as the efforts of the members. Since one police officer can't be everywhere, all of the time, it is a numbers game - the more people safeguarding the community, the better

So far, it looks like the club will consist of the following: Promoting Community Awareness. Here is an example: If you normally take a walk around the community for exercise, or walk your dog, simply take your cell phone with you. How does this make the community safer? If you see some crime or dangerous activity, you can dial 911 (which is encouraged by the police) and report it. Let's call this the most basic, spontaneous, and effortless way to protect your community.

Community Watch Patrol. This would be the organized effort to actively drive or walk about the community for the purpose of looking for crime or dangerous activity. This can be done two ways, where those patrolling identify themselves with signage on their vehicle or person, or they don't identify themselves. The later could be very effective - since an undercover community patrol will be invisible to those up to no good.

Just like studies have shown that a school is more productive when the parents are more involved, a community will be safer when the residents are very involved in promoting that safety. Safe neighborhoods have high property values, so get involved however you'd like. And remember to carry that cell phone with you. While the Security Club has not yet asked for recognition by the CSCIA, I would like to see it grow into a viable organization that benefits our entire community. Easement Patrol

The CSCIA has been conduct-

ing a survey of the properties that abut community owned land, which includes miles of easements throughout the community. Some individuals have attempted to expropriate this land for their personal use by building fences, sheds, and even garages on your land. They will be receiving letters in the near future notifying them of their encroachment and the specific remedy sought by the Board of Governors. At a minimum, the Board we will remind them that any fence, shed, or other structure will have to be removed should the Board feel it's continued presence would jeopardize the rights of the community.

Attendance: Governors Berley, Biondi, Campbell, Daly, Gallagher, Gardner, Lamb, Maltz, Mooneyhan and Newman were present. Budget Committee member Buchet was also present.

President's Remarks: President Biondi stated that there is a continuous effort to survey lots bordering CSCIA owned community properties to identify

Letters are sent to lot owners bordering CSCIA community properties reinforcing the CSCIA's right to enforce the removal of items, including structures, from community owned properties. If necessary, the CSCIA would take additional steps to continue to maintain all community property.

A motion was made to approve the February 9, 2009 CSCIA Monthly BOG meeting minutes as amended. The motion was seconded and approved with one abstention.

Motions were also made to approve the December 31, 2008 and January 31, 2009 Profit & Loss Statements. Both motions were seconded and unanimously approved.

Committee Reports:

Beaches & Parks – Governor Newman reported that he received three of the four required permits needed for the Deep Creek bulkhead repair project. Also, he is getting new signage for the park and beach areas with enhanced verbiage to better define property access restrictions in an effort to curb trespassing.

Clubhouse – Through the combined efforts of Governor Lamb and President Biondi, the committee received updated quotes to reside the clubhouse using vinyl siding. The Board reviewed the quotes and materials, and agreed to have the project completed. The Board selected a good quality siding and the colors, and agreed to accept the low bid to have the project completed.

Old Business:

The Board continued a detailed review of the CSCIA policies and procedures as they relate to "Cape Recognized Organizations." These efforts included a review of the policies for use of the CSCIA clubhouse by "Cape Recognized Organizations." Several enhancements and changes were approved, as these reviews continue. Closed Session Meeting: 9:55 P.M. – 10:15 P.M.

A motion was made and approved to enter into a Closed Session meeting at 9:55 P.M. The Closed Session meeting ended at 10:15 P.M.

Adjournment: The regular March 9, 2009 CSCIA BOG Monthly meeting ended at 10:20 P.M. The next monthly Board of Governors meeting is scheduled for April 13, 2009.


