Notice MEMBERSHIP MEETING April 24th, 7:30pm Clubhouse

At all meetings of the Association, the presence of 25 members shall be necessary to constitute a quorum. If there are insufficient members present to establish a quorum at the time a membership meeting is to be held, a substitute meeting may be called under the following procedure:

- A. A majority of the members present calls for the substitute meeting. Then,
- B. The presiding officer shall set a date falling within 30 days for a substitute meeting of members; and
- C. Notice of this substitute meeting shall be given 10 days or more in advance to all members of the Association, and shall include the following information;
 1. the time, place and purpose of the meeting; and
 - 2. a statement explaining that at the substitute meeting the members present constitute a quorum.
- All absentee published ballots not counted for lack of a quorum at a membership meeting shall be counted at the substitute meeting.

BOARD IN BRIEF

March 12, 2012

The March 2012 CSCIA Monthly Board of Governors meeting was convened on March 12, 2012 at 7:30 P.M. in the Cape St. Claire Clubhouse, Cox Meeting Room.

President's Remarks: President Mooneyhan introduced two residents in attendance and suggested that the meeting start by hearing their issues.

The first resident was present to

request a setback variance with regard to a proposed addition to his home. He commented that the neighbors have all been contacted and offered no objections. A package was presented for review. The BOG advised him that they would discuss the matter in closed session and will advise him of their decision.

The second resident presented a request for a community yard sale in the Clubhouse and on the Clubhouse parking lot. Among items that were discussed were the proposed dates, the question of Clubhouse rental fees and the use of the clubhouse tables.

Minutes and Profit and Loss Statements (P&Ls):

December 31, 2011 Profit and Loss Statements (P&Ls): Governor Dembowski made a motion to approve these P&L statements. Governor Biondi seconded the motion and it was approved with 2 abstentions.

January 31, 2012 Profit and Loss Statements (P&Ls): Governor Biondi made a motion to approve these P&L statements. Governor Newman seconded the motion and it was approved with 2 abstentions.

February 13, 2012 CSCIA

Monthly BOG meeting minutes: Governor Newman made a motion to approve these minutes. Governor Myers seconded the motion and it was approved unanimously, with a typo noted on page 1.

Governor Biondi commented that there will be a training session on the budget and that Treasurer Myers will be working on the Profit and Loss Statements to make them easier to read.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Buildings: President Mooneyhan reported that the building plans in the critical area off of Poplar Tree Drive have been approved and that clearing and construction has started.

Roads: Governor Campbell has been in touch with Kathy Sharp, AACo. Representative, for the Cape St. Claire Road widening project. She advised that tree trimming along Cape St. Claire Road should begin within the next 30 days. She also stated that all affected homeowners have been notified. Once the tree work is complete, the utility poles will be moved. There will be no actual road work until all the utility work is completed. Governor Biondi expressed concerns about the County's willingness to take down specimen trees. Discussions

Budget Committee:

Michael Buchet David Toy Scott Nogal relative to State and County requirements followed. It was noted that the same company that is taking out trees will be replanting. There was further discussion relative to crosswalks on Cape St. Claire Road

Membership and Nominating: Governor Veno had nothing to report.

Personnel and Covenants: Governor Gardner said that she had items that needed to be discussed in a closed session.

Clubhouse: Governor Lamb reported that she has two estimates for re-roofing the Clubhouse, both in the \$15,500 range, and that she is waiting on two more. She also pointed out that one of the air conditioning units needs to be replaced.

Caper: Governor Lamb commented that the Caper is doing well.

Signboard: Governor Lamb stated that she has been speaking with a sign company about replacing the signboard. She noted that she has spoken with the County regarding the future location of the signboard and the gatehouse once the road construction is complete. President Mooneyhan commented that she would ask the business owners association if they were interested in sharing a signboard.

Beaches and Parks: Governor Dembowski commented that a loose piece of equipment at the Main Beach play area was addressed. He commented that a homeowner adjacent to the upper parking lot at Deep Creek had received a bamboo eradication permit from the County. Discussions followed relative to the bamboo along the drive at Lake Claire

Website: Governor Newman commented that all of the BOG emails seemed to be working and he had nothing further to report other than a closed session matter.

Piers: Governor Biondi commented that things were generally in good shape. The new planking at Lake Claire has been striped along the edges; the new planking at Deep Creek will be striped by week's end; and work has begun on replacing pilings at Little Magothy. The piers account is in good shape.

Governor Biondi also discussed Goshen Farm. Cathy Vitale has

introduced legislation to waive the easement for 2 years. He noted that Goshen Farm has the money to start working on the house, but is unsure of the Board of Education's plans and intentions.

Treasurer: Governor Myers commented that things look fine.

OLD BUSINESS:

There was no old business.

NEW BUSINESS:

A proposal for producing the 2013 Cape calendar was presented for the BOG's approval. A request from Broadneck Grill to serve food and drink for Cinco de Mayo, in two parking spaces for the benefit of the Cystic Fibrosis

Foundation, was introduced. A request for a donation to the Cape Elementary 5K "Escape Through The Cape" fundraising run was presented.

Governor Campbell moved that the proposal for the 2013 Cape calendar be accepted. Governor Dembowski seconded the motion and, after ensuring that the proposal included placing the calendar on the CSCIA website, the motion passed unanimously.

Governor Newman moved that the CSCIA donate \$150 to the "Escape Through The Cape" 5K race. Governor Dembowski seconded the motion and, after some discussion about how it might affect traffic in the Cape, the motion passed unanimously.

Governor Dembowski offered

He noted that he has been in touch with past-year summer beach attendants to line up a crew for this summer. And lastly he noted that, with the early warm weather, he was going to have the port-a-potties in place by early April.

Adjournment: Governor Gardner made a motion to adjourn

from the regular monthly meeting and enter into a Closed Session meeting in 10 minutes. Governor Dembowski seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved. The regular March 12, 2012 CSCIA Monthly BOG meeting was adjourned at 9:00 P.M.





Cape Folk

The "roaring twenties" invokes an image of gangsters, prohibition and speakeasies. A time of lawlessness and a certain excitement. One would think that this period in history would have bypassed the sleepy little hamlet that became Cape St. Claire. But would you believe we have one resident in our community who distinctly remembers a "still" that existed directly across from what is now our shopping center?

Mrs. Wanda "Sissy" Murray is now the Cape Folk leading contender for having lived in this community the longest. The

daughter of the late John and Bella Novosel, Miss Sissy was born in a little house on Hampton Road during the "roaring twenties." She kindly allowed Cape Folk to interrupt her very busy day as one of the owners of "Bella's Sportsbar and Restaurant" for our interview. Almost two decades ago, I had the pleasure of interviewing her mother, Bella Novosel for a newspaper feature, and was fascinated by her stories of our community and its role in the growth of the Lower Broadneck Peninsula. When granddaughter-in-law Barbara Morgan suggested an interview with Miss Sissy, I welcomed the chance to hear firsthand what it was like to grow up in our community all those years ago.

According to a now out-of-print yet fascinating piece of local his-

chad.miller@edwardjones.com 410-757-1374 tory called "Broadneck - Maryland's Historic Peninsula", her father, John Novosel was known to some of the locals on the Broadneck Peninsula as "Joe Bungalow" because of his skill as a carpenter. He was the caretaker for the Farnham Farm, (that, along with) the two properties listed in the 1783 tax records covering what is now Cape St. Claire. (These properties being "Goshen" and "Persimmon Point", mentioned in Cape Folk in the September 2002 issue of the Caper.) Miss Sissy's earliest memories are of a sand and gravel Persimmon Point Road, (now Cape St. Claire Road) leading to the Howard House (Stinchcomb Farm) with its big barn filled with hay and farm equipment and a never ending supply of chickens.

She fondly recalls her Daddy

teaching her how to ride horses and told Cape Folk how much she enjoyed the warm summer days when they would go fishing together. As she recalls, the only negative aspect of life in the community back then was the absence of public electricity and the battery power generators that were extraordinary large and cumbersome to operate.

Miss Sissy also talked about the Community being just a few summer homes and how the few children who lived here year round would raid the freshly picked peaches ready for the local market to share at school. The area's strawberries, watermelon and peaches were considered some of the finest in the county.

The Brice Family owned a major tract of land which was used as a

dairy farm until the 1940s. This was formerly the Tydings property, with some 270 acres that extended north to Swan Drive. Mrs Mary Tydings Brice, wife of Carrol Brice inherited the farm in 1912 and Miss Sissy remembers that Mrs. Brice, a cook of considerable repute, baked the biggest and best biscuits you could find anywhere. "People were different then, warmer somehow", she added nostalgically. "They pitched in and helped each other. You just didn't feel alone and no one did without."

In the thirties our shopping center consisted of Harp's Variety Store, a general store where you could get "a little of everything". During the World War years Jordon's Barber Shop, Williams' Sandwich Shop, a Ceramic Shop and Wood's Laundromat were added.

Originally the site was a grocery store. It was then leased to Bill Bowman, who combined a small liquor store with an eatery and finally under Novosel ownership it became "Bella's" the first real restaurant in the shopping center. Grandmother Bella Novosel's name now also graces "Bella's Liquor Store" and summer wouldn't be the same without "Bella's Seafood", home of the greatest crabs around.

Miss Sissy is a successful entrepreneur whose other businesses have included the "Angel Miss Beauty Salon" as well as the old "Cape Hardware". Cape Folk asked what was the secret to her success. "Keeping at it", she responded. "Not giving up. I'll keep working! Arthritis, Old age isn't going to stop me. I'll fight it all the way until the Man upstairs is ready to take me!" As for the bootleg liquor and the "still" across from the shopping center during the prohibition years, "The Fed's came one day and closed it all down", she added with a laugh.

Wanda "Sissy" Novosel Murray represents what our community is all about, dedication, continuity, and the rewards of hard work. March is designated International Women's Month, acknowledging the achievements of women. From a Cape Folk standpoint Miss Sissy is a great example to us all!






