BOARD IN BRIEF

President Breeden called the meeting to order at 7:31 P.M. He said that our guests would speak prior to the scheduled agenda.

The first guest was Kyle Crosby of Hutton Miller Independent Film, seeking permission to film off of Lake Claire pier and in the parking lot for about 4 days in early May. He provided an information sheet briefly describing the film and his work. He is working with Peter Hutton, a Cape resident and Lake Claire slipholder. Neither Lake Claire nor Cape St. Claire would be mentioned by name in the film. The Board thanked him and said it would discuss the matter in New Business.

The second guest was Pat Lynch, of the Broadneck Council of Communities, of which the Cape is a member. She noted that Governor Biondi has stepped down as the Cape representative to the BCC and the Board needs to find a replacement. She gave a brief history of previous peninsula-wide community efforts, the formation and history of the BCC, and past and current efforts of the BCC with regard to comprehensive rezoning, current issues, and traffic issues. The focus is on zoning, the environment and stormwater, communications and transportation planning. There is a meeting scheduled for Thursday evening at the Cape clubhouse with 9 speakers coming to discuss issues. The Board thanked her for all the BCC has done and Governor Gardner had high praise for Pat and working with the BCC.

Governor Breeden will fill in as the Board representative temporarily. Governor Biondi thought that we might want to include BCC reports at the quarterly meetings, as updates to the Board, and as synopses and information in the Caper. He pointed out that the Cape is the largest community in the BCC.

Minutes and Profit and Loss Statements (P&Ls):

December 9, 2013 Monthly BOG meeting minutes: Governor Snow made a motion that these minutes be approved. The motion was seconded by Governor Gardner and passed.

November 30, 2013, December 31, 2013, Finals and January 31, 2014 Preliminary Profit and Loss Statements: Governor Myers made a motion to approve these P&Ls. The motion was seconded by Governor Norris and passed unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Beaches and Parks: Governor Dembowski said that things have been quiet with the cold weather. He met with South River Landscape about installing a paver-based sidewalk entering the Main Beach. He also said that on February 2nd he discovered substantial damage to the hillside between parking lots at Deep Creek, caused by ATVs. He will discuss the issue and erosion control measures with the maintenance crew.

Treasurer: Governor Myers noted that we are about where we should be at this time of the year. The SCBD budget has been submitted to the County, thanks to the efforts of the Budget Committee, Governor Breeden, and Elaine. She has been in touch with our accountant regarding non-profit status, who was negative to the idea. The Board will look into the issue further.

Events: Governor Myers said that there will be a meeting on Sunday, February 16 to begin planning the 4th of July events.

Piers: Governor Biondi reported that Piers contracts were mailed January 24. About 40 have been returned to date. The deadline is April 1, 2014. The bubbler system continues to work and is being monitored by members of the committee. As part of the new long-term planning budget, there are no major capital projects scheduled for this year. Governor Biondi will talk with the Board later in the year regarding slip fees and maintenance costs, recognizing that the piers do need to be self-sustaining.

Erosion Control: Governor Vaccaro spoke with Biohabitats, who is putting together a new grant proposal for Lake Claire.

Covenants: Governor Hazen had nothing new to report.

Budget Committee: Committee member Toy had nothing new to report.

Buildings: Governor Gardner said the only new permit was for a swimming pool, and that there is nothing new with regards to the Long Point Terrace property.

Communications: Governor Snow will be meeting with the Executive Board to document a communications policy and look at future technology needs.

Website: Governor Newman asked members to send any information to be posted or post it themselves, and asked that they verify their assignments on the page.

Caper: Governor Lamb would like articles for the next issue as soon as possible.

Clubhouse: Governor Lamb said that Clubhouse rentals have been slow over the winter but are picking up now.

Membership: Governor Norris is trying to line up an erosion control person for a meeting, and possibly a mosquito control person for the April quarterly meeting. She has gotten more volunteers to work on events.

Security: Governor Breeden said that the cold weather has kept things quiet. He mentioned the ATV damage at Deep Creek, noted that community service is being performed as mandated by the court, and said that reports by our nighttime security personnel show that things are quiet. There is a Neighborhood Watch meeting planned in March with an AAPD representative.

President's Remarks: President Breeden thanked those who emailed early committee reports. He asked that anyone wishing to be the BCC representative let him know. He would like a 1 to 3 year plan from each committee member with the goal of involving residents, through the Caper, to get input on various ideas for improving the Cape. He also asked that members send their committee chair job descriptions to Governor Norris.

OLD BUSINESS:


The Board received a letter of complaint from a resident regarding an ATV racetrack at 1089 River Bay Road. The County and the Police, when contacted, have indicated there are no violations there. Letters have been sent to the resident and been replied to with counter-complaints. There was some discussion that what is going on may be a violation of some covenant. It was thought that the Board needed a good description of what was actually going

on and perhaps complaints from more people in the neighborhood. It was suggested that we try and get responses from all the neighbors within 300 feet of the noise and that we monitor the decibel levels ourselves. A motion was made by Governor Biondi that the Board agree to purchase a decibel meter and try to document the activity as brought the complainant. The motion was seconded by Governor Myers and passed.

Governor Lamb is looking into getting a more up to date electronic signboard. This is a good time as the old one will need to be moved or removed with the Cape St. Claire Road work. She is looking into other locations for the signboard.

NEW BUSINESS:

The request to film at Lake Claire was discussed. It was stipulated that their activities cannot impede normal activities of Cape residents, that any generator noise has to be kept to a minimum, and that filming activities can only take place Monday through Friday. By consensus, the Board agreed that the filming was permitted with the stipulations as noted.

Governor Dembowski is leaving sample books of pervious pavers for members to look at. He would like to the look in with whatever new sidewalk is going in at the Clubhouse.

There will be a 7:00 P.M. meeting at the Clubhouse on Thursday, February 20^{th} , with the County explaining all the aspects of the Cape St. Claire Road work and water expansion. The meeting will be noted in the Caper, on the sign-board, on the Cape Facebook page and on the Cape website.

Governor Norris will talk with the BLOA about placement and possible cost-sharing of the new signboard.

Governor Biondi said that he would like to see absences and abstentions listed in the minutes.

ADJOURNMENT:

Governor Biond moved that the Board adjourn. The motion was seconded by Governor Newman and approved unanimously. The February 10, 2014 regular monthly meeting of the Board of Governors was adjourned at 9:08 P.M.


ATTENDANCE:

Saint Patrick, who lived during the fifth century, is the patron saint and national apostle of Ireland. Born in Roman Britain, he was kidnapped and brought to Ireland as a slave at the age of 16. He later escaped, but returned to Ireland and was credited with bringing Christianity to its people. In the centuries following Patrick's death (believed to have been on March 17, 461), the mythology surrounding his life became ever more ingrained in the Irish culture: Perhaps the most well known legend is that he explained the Holy Trinity (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) using the three leaves of a native Irish clover, the shamrock.

Today, people of all backgrounds celebrate St. Patrick's Day, especially throughout the United States, Canada and Australia. Although North America is home to the largest productions, St. Patrick's Day is celebrated in many other locations far from Ireland, including Japan, Singapore and Russia.

In modern-day Ireland, St. Patrick's Day was traditionally been a religious occasion. In fact, up until the 1970s, Irish laws mandated that pubs be closed on March 17. Beginning in 1995, however, the Irish government began a national campaign to use interest in St. Patrick's Day to drive tourism and showcase Ireland and Irish culture to the rest of the world. Today, approximately 1 million people annually take part in Ireland 's St. Patrick's Festival in Dublin, a multi-day celebration featuring parades, concerts, outdoor theater productions and fireworks shows.

CAPE ST. CLAIRE ROAD EXPANSION MEETING RECAP

On Thursday, February 20th, 2014 at 7pm, the CSCIA hosted an Anne Arundel County Department of Public Works meeting regarding the upcoming road widening of Cape St. Claire Road. In attendance that night was the Honorable Dick Ladd, 7 County employees from multiple departments, and 60 plus residents of Cape St. Claire. The highlights of the project are listed below:

- Expected to start on March 24th, 2014 and end December 29th, 2014, at total of 280 days.
- The project will widened Cape St. Claire Road between Woodland Circle/ St Claire Court and Little Magothy View/ Hilltop Drive, which will also include the following: sidewalks on both sides of Cape St. Claire Road, shouders, curbs, gutters and drainage upgrades.
- A turn lane will be added on Cape St. Claire Road at Hilltop to better facilitate traffic. This will mean the Community Guard House and Sign Board will be moved further back toward the tree line.
- There will be extensive storm water management improvements, including a step pool conveyance system near the firehouse, root pruning of existing trees and reforestation along the affected areas.
- Installation of a 12-inch diameter Water Main connection between Forrest Terrace and Hilltop Drive along Cape St. Claire Road, with possible connections available to residents in this area and connections available to the side streets included in scope of the project.
- It should be expected that throughout of the duration of the 9 month project, lane closures will occur Monday-Friday from 9am-3pm, with provisions being made to have a minimal impact on Emergency Services, mail delivery, trash collection, school bus services and traffic.
- During the course of the project, the County will keep the community updated on the construction schedule via social media, including Twitter, Facebook and their website. We will be adding an additional page to our website at www.cscia.org to include information provided by the County Department of Public Works, which will include PDF's, Facebook, & Twitter links regarding the expansion project as we receive them. We will also attempt to forward information via our Cape St. Claire Improvement Association, Inc. Facebook page in order to provide timely information where possible.
- If additional meetings are needed, we will coordinate where possible.



This will be the largest project by the County in Cape St. Claire in recent history. I ask all Capers to prepare for the next 9 months by reviewing county information, planning ahead, staying connected and exercising patience during the course of the project. 
