

The CSCIA Board of Governors met for its monthly meeting on April 14, 2008 at the Cape St. Claire Clubhouse at 7:30 p.m. in the Cox Meeting Room. President Josephine Gardner provided opening remarks and presented the agenda for the meeting.

Attendance: Governors Biondi, Campbell, Gardner, Lamb, Maltz, Morgan, Newman and Wolin were in attendance. Governors Daly, Gallagher and Pollock were absent.

President Josephine Gardner's Remarks: The forms received from the Maryland Department of Agriculture on mosquito control were completed and submitted. Representatives from that Department will be at the April 22, 2008 Quarterly Membership meeting. Councilman Cathy Vitale will also attend the April 22, 2008 meeting to discuss the Goshen Farm and "school capacity" issues.

An e-mail was received from a resident suggesting the CSCIA purchase the lot located at the Cape St. Claire Road/Hilltop Drive intersection next to Graul's, and that we let the County use the buffer area if needed, to improve that intersection. Mr. Jim Schrolls, County Road Department, will be at the May 12, 2008 Monthly BOG meeting to discuss the Cape St. Claire Road improvement project.

Minutes and Financials:

Motions were made to approve the March 10, 2008 Monthly BOG Meeting Minutes as Amended, and the February 29, 2008 Financials. These motions were seconded and unanimously approved.

Agenda Item:

A resident requested a building variance to build a privacy fence with the "good side" facing the inside instead of facing the outside as required by the CSCIA Building Code. He was provided an opportunity to address the Board to detail the reasons for his request. The reasons included: Neighbors adjourning the sides of his property have several dogs that bark when they see people and attempt to bite if given the opportunity; and existing chain link fences on the sides make it difficult to build a fence immediately adjacent with the "good side" out due to the lack of working room.

After lengthy discussion, the BOG approved a motion to meet in a Closed Session to decide on the building variance. After the Closed Session meeting, it was announced that the requested building variance was denied.

Committee Reports:

Clubhouse – Governor Lamb reported that the double-doors on the water side of the clubhouse were replaced this month.

Beaches and Parks – Governor Newman reported that a location was chosen at the Deep Creek area to install parking gates with card sensors. He will submit an application for installation and assurance that the selected location for the Deep Creek area is acceptable.

Referring back to the March 10, 2008 Monthly BOG Meeting Minutes, a couple of board members again expressed concern about the parking gate and card sensor project at the Deep Creek and Lake Claire areas, including administrative issues, vandalism of equipment, project costs and other related issues. Governor Newman addressed each of these concerns with the Board.

Roads – Governor Campbell expressed exasperation about the slow progress the County is making on the Cape St. Claire Road improvement project. Steps identified six months ago have not been taken, or, have progressed very slowly. The "90% com

Strawberry Festival in 1965; the Cape held several preludes of what was to be. In the 50s the social organizing belonged to the Women's Activities Committee. They planned parties for children, started the Teen club, and held dances for adults complete with live music and a floor show. However, there were three fund raising events which were important for everyone: the Flower Mart, May Mart, and the Bazaar. The Flower Mart was usually at the Club House the first weekend in May to coincide with Annapolis' big flower mart. Baskets, seedlings, and planters were sold, and of course there

was a bake sale.

The May Mart was bigger and it marked the end of the winter. and welcomed the summer folks. Food was sold by the only 3 organizations around then: the Volunteer Fire Department and Auxiliary, the Methodist Church which met at the Club House, and the WAC. Since most women were in all 3 organizations, they were working triple time. There were games of chance like a cake walk, and ring toss, and a horse shoe tournament in the park which ran all day. Jars with pictures of teen girls were placed at the Variety Store, Lawson's, and the gas station, and the person with the most money on the day of the Mart was crowned Queen of the May.

The biggest event was the Bazaar, which had all that the May Mart had plus a merry-goround, pony rides, and, sometimes, even a small Ferris wheel. Later in the afternoon there was a "bathing beauty" contest to choose Miss Cape St Claire. In 1957, as if this was not enough summer fun, the Fire Department started its annual Carnival which was held in the area where McDonald's and Wendy's sit now. This carnival ran for two weekends in mid

summer. In 1965 a new resident from Texas joined the WAC and brought with her the idea of a Strawberry Festival combining the Flower, May Mart and the Bazaar. Before 1975 the

Strawberry Festival was a one day event much like it is today, but after 1975 it became a two day party. Unfortunately organizing a two party of this magnitude can be overwhelming and the festival did not happen for several years in the mid eighty's. When it resumed it was brought back to a one day event. In 1983 they celebrated the 25th Anniversary of the Strawberry Festival which would make 2008 the 50th Anniversary. In reality the Official Strawberry Festival did not begin until 1965 which only puts us at our 43rd Anniversary.

The Goshen Farm Preservation Society was awarded a \$150,000 Bond for renovation of the Farm House. If you would like to be a part of this experience please email us at goshenfarm@cscia.org

STANDARD MOSQUITO CONTROL OPERATING PROCECURES

NOTE: CAPE RESIDENTS who wish to be excluded from any adult mosquito control services must contact the Maryland Department of Agriculture in writing. Pre-printed forms may be picked up at the Cape office, 1223 River Bay road. Forms must be received by the County by May 15, 2008.

The Anne Arundel County & City of Annapolis Mosquito Control Program is conducted by the Mosquito Control Section of the Maryland Department of Agriculture, located in Annapolis, under cooperative agreement with the County and City Governments.

The following services will be conducted in the indicated time frames:

County-wide Surveillance and Control of Larval Mosquitoes: March – October Surveillance and Control of Adult Mosquitoes: County Wide Mid-May – September 25:

OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR SPRAYING OF ADUTICIDES/LAVICIDES

Spraying for adult mosquitoes will be done only if a Maryland Department of Agriculture inspector determines it is necessary.

Nuisance Abatement Thresholds for Ground Based ULV Treatments:

Landing Counts 3 mosquitoes landing in 2 minutes 1 mosquito landing in 1 minute

Light Trap Collections: 12 female mosquitoes in an unbaited light trap

24 female mosquitoes in a baited light trap

Light trap collections must be female mosquitoes of species known to bite man per night in <u>un-baited</u> traps.

SPRAY SCHEDULE FOR LARVICIDES/ADULTICIDES

Larvicides (Treatment for mosquito larvae)

Monday - Friday

Adulticide (Treament for adult mosquitoes)

Sunday – Thursday

After 7:30 p.m.

Spraying will not be conducted during rain, in wind speeds exceeding 12 MPH, or temperatures above 89F.

The Mosquito Control Program does not spray for Midges that swarm on homes, boats, trees, and shrubs along many Anne Arundel County Rivers. These non-biting insects that develop in mud bottoms of slow moving water ways of low dissolved oxygen and will decline in numbers within a few weeks after they first appear.
