President's Perspective

Message from the President and Chair of the Beaches and Parks Committee

Spring has sprung in the Cape!

With the great weather we've had this Spring, the beaches and parks have been in full swing extra early this year. Due to the increase in use, we decided to bring in the porta-potties a month earlier than usual, and our beach attendants will be starting on May 5th.

To help everyone get the most enjoyment from our great beaches and parks, please keep a few things in mind. No glass bottles are allowed on the beaches, and with all of the various debris that washed up during last year's storms, we recommend everyone wear water shoes when using the beaches and when going into the water.

No motorized vessels are allowed on Cape beaches. This includes boats, personal water craft and motorized skiffs. No boats are allowed to anchor in the designated swim area off of the Main Beach. And speaking of the swim area, we'd like to thank Ms. Ann Miller at Maryland DNR for providing Cape St. Claire six new "swim area" buoys for our Main Beach. We also understand that a Cape resident named "Matt," who works at DNR, was kind enough to provide a quick delivery of the buoys. Thanks Matt! The bouys will be placed in the water by the end of May.. Hopefully, we'll be able to remove "Chessie the Tree Monster" from the water off of the Main Beach by then also. It shifts weekly and can be dangerous to climb on, so please keep off of it and tell kids to keep clear.

Fishing is allowed only at the Lake Claire Pier, which was built specifically for Cape residents to use for fishing and crabbing. Fishing is not allowed on any other Cape pier or beach, with the exception of the beach area all the way down next to the inlet at the Little Magothy River.

Parking is often at a premium during the warm months, and the CSCIA has a duty to protect the Cape's assets so that they are clean and available for Cape residents to use. This means that vehicles that are not displaying current Cape stickers or a current Cape guest pass may be towed. Maintenance fees were due by March 1, 2012 and the black and white 2011 stickers and passes will expire on May 1, 2012. Your \$10 fee gets you two stickers and one guest pass. One additional

sticker may be purchased for \$5.00. All vehicles must be registered in your name or Cape address. Any maintenance fee paid after March 1, 2012 is also subject to a \$5.00 late fee. PLEASE display your CURRENT stickers and passes when using the beaches and parks. The last thing we want is to have a good neighbor's car get towed because of a sticker or guest pass issue. And remember that guest passes are not valid for trailering at Deep Creek on weekends and holidays

BOARD IN BRIEF

April 9, 2012

The April 2012 CSCIA Monthly Board of Governors meeting was convened on April 9, 2012 at 7:34 P.M. in the Cape St. Claire Clubhouse, Cox Meeting Room.

President's Remarks: After brief remarks, President Mooneyhan turned the meeting over to Vice-President Biondi. Vice-President Biondi addressed a resident who was present to reiterate

President Mooneyhan noted that Ron George and Cathy Vitale will be speaking at the April membership meeting.

President Mooneyhan noted that we now have over 1600 votes in favor of changing the covenants. She will be contacting the state for further guidance.

President Mooneyhan advised that the CSCIA State Farm agent has retired. A new agent will be assigned so we will be requesting an agent in or near Anne Arundel County with waterfront experience.

Minutes and Profit and Loss Statements (P&Ls):

March 12, 2012 CSCIA Monthly BOG meeting min-

utes: Governor Gardner made a motion to approve the March 12, 2012 minutes. Governor Biondi seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

February 29, and March 31, 2011 Profit and Loss Statements (P&Ls): Governor Biondi made a motion to approve these P&L statements. Governor Newman seconded the motion and it was approved with 1 abstention.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Buildings: President Mooneyhan commented that there had been 3 requests for decks this week and all were approved. She thanked Governor Biondi for his help on building issues

Piers: Vice-President Biondi re-

ported that all but a couple of contracts have been received and that there have been several requests for sub-leases. The piers account is in the black and doing well.

Treasurer: Governor Myers commented that things were going smoothly and that she will be meeting with our CPA soon.

Mosquito Control: Governor Gardner received an email from the State relative to requesting mosquito spraying. The State is looking to cut costs and will spray only where indicated by active traps. Spraying will start next month, probably on Tuesdays or Thursdays. Governor Gardener will stay on top of the situation.

Personnel: Governor Gardner

said there were matters she wanted to discuss in a closed session.

Caper: Governor Lamb noted that the Caper is doing well and that advertising is good.

Clubhouse: Governor Lamb reported that there had been a wastewater main backup on Easter Sunday that resulted in some minor flooding. A plumber has been contracted to address the problem.

Signboard: There was discussion of replacing the Cape sign. President Mooneyhan and Governor Lamb spoke favorably about a sign at the entrance of Broadneck Park. Concerns were raised relative to the sign being installed at a height which would deter vandalism.

Website: Governor Newman reported that he had a legal matter which needed to be discussed in closed session.

Beaches & Parks: Governor Dembowski commented that residents are pleased that the port-apots have arrived early. He noted that the patch of bamboo at Deep Creek has been cleared by the adjacent resident and native trees and bushes have been replanted. Governor Dembowski commented that roaming towing of illegally parked vehicles has begun and the beach attendants will be starting on April 28.

Roads: Governor Campbell commented that while there are new markings on Cape St. Claire Road, to date no tree removal has begun.

commented that he would like to reserve the Cape sign to announce the upcoming membership meeting. He also noted that he would post a temporary sign at the Green Holly sign location at least a week in advance possibly mentioning the guest speakers.

OLD BUSINESS:

The BOG thanked Governor
Biondi for the research he did on
the request by Broadneck Grill to
serve liquor outside for Cinco de
Mayo. Governor Biondi moved
that, in view of the fact that permission is legal according to the
Liquor Board, and that the
CSCIA is indemnified against
any liability, the BOG grant permission for Broadneck Grill to
use two parking spaces to serve

outdoor drinks for Cinco de Mayo. The motion was seconded by Governor Veno and approved with an 8-1 vote by the BOG.

The bamboo at Lake Claire was mentioned by Governor Campbell. There was discussion of the difficulties related to eradication. Governor Dembowski commented that he would talk to the tree removal people about eradication.

Governor Newman commented on the legality of the "no loitering, no skateboarding, no bicycles" signs along the sidewalks at the shopping center. President Mooneyhan said she would discuss the issue at the next BOLA meeting.

Governor Veno noted that the residents near the intersection of

Latrobe and St. Margaret's would like the intersection reviewed for sight distance issues and stop sign placement. Governor Lamb commented that she believes the County may have studied the intersection pre-

viously. This led to a general discussion of the problems of speeding and failure to stop that is epidemic in the Cape. Governor Veno moved that the Roads chairman look into options for speed control at the intersection of Latrobe and St. Margaret's. Governor Biondi seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Governor Myers pointed out that the times on the County "school hours" sign at the elementary school are incorrect. Governor Lamb will ask the county to address this issue.

A resident attended the meeting to discuss the brush on a CSCIA lot on Little Magothy View. He was concerned about the clearing of and disposal of brush, leaves, and branches left by BG&E's cutting crews. He inquired about he and his neighbors helping to clear and maintain the lot. Governor Dembowski thanked him for his willingness to help and explained that the BOG would discuss the issue

Adjournment: Governor Newman made a motion to adjourn from the regular monthly meeting and enter into a Closed Session meeting. Governor Dembowski seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved. The regu-

The Strawberry Festival A Cape St. Claire **Tradition**





Goshen Farm Preservation Society

In 1965 the Cape held several preludes of what was to be. In the 50s the social organizing belonged to the Women's Activities Committee. They planned parties for children, started the Teen club, and held dances for adults complete with live music and a floor show. However, there were three fund raising events which were important for everyone: the Flower Mart, May Mart, and the Bazaar. The Flower Mart was usually at the Club House the first weekend in May to coincide with Annapolis' big flower mart. Baskets, seedlings, and planters were sold, and of course there was a bake sale.

The May Mart was bigger and it marked the end of the winter, and welcomed the summer folks. Food was sold by the only 3 organizations around then: the Volunteer Fire Department and Auxiliary, the Methodist Church which met at the Club House, and the WAC. Since most women were in all 3 organizations, they were working triple time. There were games of chance like a cake walk, and ring toss, and a horse shoe tournament in the park which ran all day. Jars with pictures of teen girls were placed at the Variety Store, Lawson's, and the gas station, and the person with the most money on the day of the Mart was crowned Queen of the May.

The biggest event was the Bazaar, which had all that the May Mart had plus a merry-go-round, pony rides, and, sometimes, even a

small Ferris wheel. Later in the afternoon there was a "bathing beauty" contest to choose Miss Cape St Claire. In 1957, as if this was not enough summer fun, the Fire Department started its annual Carnival which was held in the area where McDonald's and Wendy's sit now. This carnival ran for two weekends in mid summer. In 1965 a new resident from Texas joined the WAC and brought with her the idea of a Strawberry Festival combining the Flower, May Mart and the Bazaar. Before 1975 the Strawberry Festival was a one day event much like it is today, but after 1975 it became a two day party. Unfortunately organizing a two party of this magnitude can be overwhelming and the festival did not happen for several years in the mid eighty's. When it resumed it was brought back to a

one day event.


