### BOARD IN BRIEF

#### CSCIA BOARD OF GOVERNORS MONTHLY MEETING AUGUST 8, 2011

The August 2011 CSCIA Monthly Board of Governors meeting was convened on August 8, 2011 at 7:30 P.M. in the Cape St. Claire Clubhouse, Cox Meeting Room.

**President's Remarks:** President Gallagher presented the agenda for the meeting and made brief opening remarks. He noted that he received an email on the subject of a telephone tower and may invite the sender to address the membership at a Quarterly Membership meeting

#### Minutes and Profit & Loss Statements (P&Ls):

**July 11, 2011 CSCIA Monthly BOG meeting minutes:** Governor Newman made a motion to approve these minutes. Governor Gardner seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

**June 30, 2011 Profit & Loss Statements (P&L's):** Governor Newman made a motion to approve these P&L's. Governor Lamb seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS:

#### Covenants: Governor Daly

- Distributed an updated status report of zoning and other violations reported to the County for action. The County Zoning Department is referring one of these cases to the County Court system to be heard around November 2011.

A motion was made and approved to have a CSCIA employee attend a case put before the County Administrative Hearing Officer to voice opposition to a zoning variance request being made by a Cape resident.

**Piers:** President Gallagher reported that the revamping and updating of the Piers Committee database will cost about \$450.

#### Comments from the Floor:

Budget Committee Chairman, Mike Buchet, stated that he will be conducting a review of budget line item targets to determine if any adjustments may be necessary.

**Attendance:** Governors Daly, Gallagher, Gardner, Lamb and Newman were present. Governors Berley, Campbell, Dembowski and Mooneyhan were absent. Budget Committee Chairman, Buchet was also present.

**Adjournment:** A motion was made and approved to adjourn from the regular monthly meeting. The regular August 8, 2011 CSCIA Monthly BOG meeting was adjourned at 8:30 P.M.

## Outstanding Teen

On a recent muggy evening, I had the pleasure of experiencing the new Goshen Farm Walking Trail with its impressive creator, 17-year-old Cape resident Corinne Bailey, as my guide.

Corinne conceived, planned and constructed the self-guided historical walking trail as her Girl Scout Gold Award project. The informative trail provides interesting facts along an 11-point tour.

The Goshen Farm site includes an historic house built in the 1780's, several remaining outbuildings, and 22 acres of open space that will one day be a center for history and nature interpretation. Corinne explained that her "passion" for the property grew out of her family's involvement with the [Goshen Farm Preservation Society](#) (GFPS), which was

formed in 2007 with the purpose of preserving and restoring the property for generations to come. "It's interesting to me to think that years and years ago, people were seeing the same things we see now," said Corinne.

Corinne has been a Girl Scout since the first grade and, in addition to the Gold Award, she also completed her Bronze and Silver Awards. For her Bronze Award, Corinne installed the flagpole and garden at the Cape Main Beach along with two other Scouts in her troop.

Her Silver project was also a group project with two other Scouts. They planned, coordinated, and implemented a day for younger Scouts focusing on pet care, animals that work (service animals), spaying and neutering, pet health and nutrition, etc. They called it "Pet University" and had both a representative from Guiding Eyes for the Blind there as well as a local veterinarian for an educational presentation.

The Girl Scout Gold Award is equivalent to the Boy Scout's Eagle Scout Award. Corinne's project required her to spend at least 65 hours on the planning and implementation of her project – tasks that required her to invoke the leadership skills that she had been developing over the years as a Girl Scout.

Her efforts involved coordinating with the GFPS, Anne Arundel County Facilities Department, and the Anne Arundel County Public Schools in order to complete the project. She also presented her project idea to the Anne Arundel County Council very early on in the process. Corinne coordinated the donation of materials and volunteer labor to install the trail markers and de-

signed the trail guide which can be found on the GFPS website. The GFPS expressed their appreciation for Corinne's contribution to the property.

"Corinne's trail has brought more positive attention to the property and our efforts, and we look forward to having Cape residents support us as we try to keep Cape history intact," said Barbara Morgan, President of the GFPS. Corinne plans to continue to support the GFPS with its restoration efforts. After graduating with honors from Broadneck High School this year, she plans to enter Towson University's Honors College in the fall.

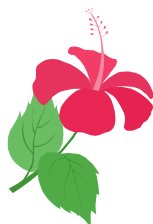

## BACK TO SCHOOL

Motorists, please be sure to watch for children as they walk to and from school. And parents, please remind your children to look both ways when crossing the road, use cross walks and watch for cars.

The CSCIA wishes our many students and teachers a safe and productive school year.

Dear Parents and Guardians:

As I promised you in my letter of June 10, 2011, county and school system officials have continued a dialogue throughout the summer in an effort to best address the traffic issues that exist at Cape St. Claire Elementary School. These discussions have been fruitful, and have resulted in some new approaches that the group believes will help greatly in the coming year.

Effective August 23, 2011, the first day of school, the following will be in effect:

- The county Police Department will station two crossing guards in front of the school to help assist students who are walking to and from school. Crossing guards remain under the jurisdiction of the Police Department, not the school system, and will have specific duties as determined by the Police Department.
- The bus loop will be open for morning student drop-off and afternoon student pickup after the buses have departed. Staff members will be holding portable signs noting when the bus loop is open for this purpose. During this time, vehicles exiting the bus loop are encouraged to make a right turn onto Blue Ridge Drive, since making a left will only increase traffic congestion.
- A sign will be in place directing parents to pull to the top of the front curb in the main parking lot during morning drop-off and. This will allow for a more consistent traffic flow. All students, including kindergartners and first-graders, who are driven to school should be dropped off in this area.
- The middle section of the main parking lot will be closed during morning drop-off to allow for a constant traffic flow, thus reducing backups.
- Vehicles exiting the main parking lot during morning drop-off and afternoon pickup will not be allowed to turn left onto Blue Ridge Drive. This is the same process that was in place last year.
- Overflow parking will be created in the field next to the bus lane to allow parents to park and/or wait for the bus lane to open for student pickup or drop-off. This area will be marked by signs.

We will continue our practice of dismissing students who ride buses first, followed by car riders and walkers. This will allow the buses to depart as quickly as possible and open the bus lane for parents picking up students.

In addition, the county is working to replace signage, add new signage, and trim foliage along Blue Ridge Drive, Hampton Road, and Plateau Place.

Our dedicated group of parent volunteers that has helped with traffic in the morning in previous years will be on hand to assist again this year. I am deeply appreciative to those parents who take time from their busy schedules to help out, and I hope all parents will heed their instructions.

The county, our school staff, and our school system will continue to monitor the situation throughout the first few weeks of school to determine what, if any, alterations need to be made. As always, I appreciate your continued input and willingness to work constructively with us as we seek the best possible solutions for our students.

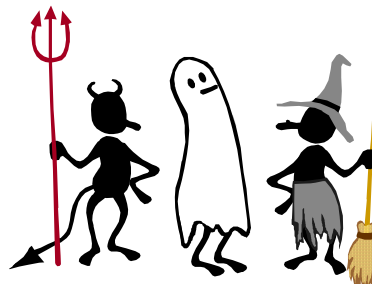

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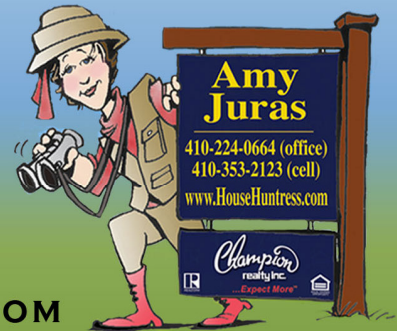

This event is to help raise awareness of ATRT cancer and its 11 year old victim, Joey Sudo. Joey was diagnosed with ATRT in 2007. After undergoing chemotherapy & radiation therapy, he was cancer free for two years. In May 2010, Joey was diagnosed with a recurrence and started the battle again. With the proceeds from last year's tournament, Joey traveled to Houston, TX to have proton radiation therapy. The treatment was successful, leaving his tumors "dead." In June 2011, Joey was diagnosed with another

reoccurrence. However, the only treatment options left are experimental. All of the proceeds will go to Joey and his family. About ATRT:

Atypical Teratoid Rhabdoid tumor is a rare tumor that is usually diagnosed in early childhood. ATRT can occur anywhere in the central nervous system. In the United States, three children per 1,000,000 or around 30 new ATRT cases are diagnosed each year. The survival rate for children under 3 is less than 10%. Older children, when treated with chemotherapy and radiation, are closer to 70%. Joey is the first recorded case in medical history for this type of cancer to return.
