The pervious paver walkway at the entrance to the park was started in May 2014 (Phase I) and extended out towards the beach as part of Phase II. The path splits in two direction towards the overlook and the playground. This will give access via a safe and dry path for all our residents. I believe you will find the walkway both convenient and aesthetically pleasing while enhancing one of our premier community properties. We will work on Phase III for next year, where we are planning to address the access to the beach, the old cinder block wall and broken concrete paths to create a more convenient, safer and improved entry for residents of all ages.

With June comes summer and with that we all know that the first Saturday in June is the Strawberry Festival, a 50 plus year tradition in Cape St. Claire. This year will be no different, the Strawberry Festival Committee has a fun

BOARD IN BRIEF

President Breeden called the meeting to order at 7:32 P.M. He said it's been a busy month with covenants, piers, buildings, security, community service, Touch a Truck, and the Cape Escape. He said help will be needed at the Board's booth at the Strawberry Festival.

The minutes of April 13, 2015 were approved with one change.

The final P&Ls of March 31, 2015 were approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Beaches and Parks: Governor Dembowski said that the beaches are becoming busy and the permitted filming on our beaches was completed.

Treasurer: Governor Myers said funds were moved from operating to the capital budget to cover the costs of building the shed at the Clubhouse and phase II of the beach path, as voted on at the last quarterly meeting. She also said that revenues for Clubhouse, Caper and Piers have already met expectations, and there are still two months left on the fiscal year. We are still waiting for the remainder of our SCBD funds.

Events:Governor Myers said planning will begin in earnest for the festivities of the 4th and the web page needs to go up.

Technology: Governor Szczytko said he installed a SSL certificate to our website, which ensures safe browsing but also sets us up for accepting online payments. He continued site improvements for speed and communication, and added the CSCIA Facebook stream to the website. He has been working on Cape Conservation Corps website. He also noted that the <u>CSC Strawberry Festival</u> website is done with a Sponsors Page, Crafters Page, and Community Organizations page.

Strawberry Festival: Governor Lamb said the web page gives us the opportunity to thank everyone who helps with the Strawberry Festival. The banners have been hung, thanks to Harry Sawyer and all events and activities are lined up.

Caper: Governor Lamb commented that she will be sending out new contracts this week. Timely submittals continue to be a challenge.

Clubhouse: Governor Lamb noted that the shed should arrive in about 10 days. She has been working with the electrician to complete the outdoor lighting and repair an issue in the kitchen. She has also been working on a revised contract and list of fees. Rentals are steady.

Piers: Governor Small said there are only handful of slips yet to fill. June 1 will be the deadline to start enforcing stickers and non-use of slips. The first projects on Deep Creek will be starting this week or next. Governor

Breeden added that illegal use of boat ramp enforcement is underway, and that the committee met and approved some urgent and immediate fixes to our piers and major replacement of the Deep Creek Large Pier for later this calendar year. He also noted actual revenues now exceed budgeted revenues for FY 2015.

Erosion Control: Governor Vaccaro said the phragmites burn at Lake Claire was successful and we now have a full acre of cleared area ready for planting. Seed will be ordered and plantings will commence. Another adjoining property owner of Lake Claire has signed on for reforestation work to help get invasive plants under control. Broadneck High School will be doing service project work around the Lake in early June. They will plant trees, scatter seed and remove invasive plants. The targeted work at Deep Creek along our hillsides has been moved to the fall, as it will be cooler and any removal and replanting will have a better survival rate. There will be some targeted spraying around Lake Claire throughout the summer months.

Cape Conservation Corps, formerly Friends of Lake Claire, has officially filed Articles of Incorporation.

Budget: Chairman Buchet said the committee is meeting next Tuesday and would like BOG committee funding requests by then.

Building: Governor Breeden said we continue to receive and respond within a two week time frame for all new building requests. We have added a volunteer member resident to our building committee, who is an licensed architect, to help regarding new home building issues and some review of best practices that we should possibly consider.

Security: Governor Breeden said we have had several incidents including trespassing after hours by non-residents, underage drinking issues and some vandalism at our beaches and parks. We are coordinating with the Police regarding these matters. Towing enforcement has begun along with regular checks throughout the day of our parking facilities by the Security Committee.

board in brief continued.....

Roads: Governor Breeden noted that Project Manager and County DPW provided the community with an update at the quarterly meeting. The new mobilization date is May 18th. He said the Board has stressed to the County the job must be finished before next winter as we cannot go another winter without paving.

Mosquito Control: Governor Breeden said we are on the list for the community spraying program and we will provide information as we receive it from the State.

Covenants: Governor Breeden reported 24 ongoing investigations, many of which involve different County Agencies coordination.

OLD BUSINESS:

Regarding comments at the last quarterly meeting about new development, Governor Breeden will meet with the concerned residents and the building committee to review our building codes and best practices.

NEW BUSINESS:

Governor Dembowski said that JB Parking Lot Striping will donate time and equipment to mark off parking spaces in the field for Strawberry Festival.

Governor Dembowski is researching upgrading our current security infrastructure.

Governor Lamb said Mosquito Joe has offered to spray the beach for Strawberry Festival, but because of environmental and health concerns the Board declined the offer.

Governor Vaccaro noted that we need money to buy seed to cover the acre cleared at Lake Claire, and asked the Board to think about a stormwater project at Deep Creek.

There was a discussion of maintenance on the Clubhouse rock garden and whether converting it to a rain garden would be feasible.

Governor Breeden noted that Fairwinds Marina comment period for pending permits is open, but at this time the board has no objections to the proposed work. Fairwinds has also been proactive with projected projects and property updates.

Deep Creek Piers will be getting some emergency maintenance and repairs in the next month. Safety is a priority and is being addressed. An assessment of our BGE bills and consumption will occur and the cost of electricity has dropped dramatically now that we are into warmer months.

Governors Breeden and Small, along with a local pier contractor, checked out all the deferred maintenance at the piers and determined that there is about \$60,000 worth of work that needs to be done as soon as possible. We have the allotted budgeted money to commit to the work this fall. There was discussion of the bidding process and the future budgeting needs of the piers and its projects. Governor Breeden moved that we forego getting comparable bids for repairing the T at the Deep Creek large pier again and move forward with having Walsh & Sons to complete the project as intended in 2013. The motion was seconded by Governor Vaccaro and passed unanimously.

ADJOURNMENT:

The meeting was adjourned at 8:46 P.M.

MEMBERS PRESENT:

Governors Breeden, Dembowski, Lamb, Myers, Small, Szczytko, and Vaccaro were present. Governor Snow was absent. Also present were Budget Committee chairman Buchet and member Toy, along with Administrative Assistant Coble.


In addition to the parade, the festivities will continue at the Main Beach from 11:00AM to 2:00PM and will include games such as:



News from Goshen Farm Preservation Society

We continue our series of articles on Goshen Farm's History written by Elisabeth Slone. With the assistance of Scott Powers, Chair of our History and Research Committee, Elisabeth continues to reveal Goshen's past. We hope you enjoy learning more about the house we are trying to save and the land we are trying to preserve.



History is like a looking glass through which we see not only ourselves, but the greater world around us. As we continue to delve deeper into the history of Goshen Farm, it is important to understand that the events that took place here in our backyards were closely tied to events taking place on the other side of the world.

We know that Goshen Farm, originally called "Leonard's Neck," was granted to Henry Woolchurch who first appears in Anne Arundel County land records in 1653. This was only 11 years after Charles I granted Lord Baltimore the charter for the colony of Maryland in 1632. At this time, England was on the brink of its own civil war between those who favored monarchy and those who favored parliamentary government. Charles I had Catholic sympathies and was later executed by his Protestant parliament in1649, the year that Annapolis was established. In the1600s, religious toleration was not common and rulers dictated religion within their spheres of influence. England at the time of the English Civil War was no exception. The Maryland Colony was formed as a haven for Catholics escaping the persecution they faced from the largely Protestant parliament. As such, Maryland was one of the few places where religious toleration was largely practiced.

However, Maryland was not immune to the conflicts taking place in England at that time. Despite attempts by Lord Baltimore to ease tensions, the Battle of the Severn broke out between Catholics supporting Lord Baltimore and Puritans, who largely supported parliament. Henry Woolchurch was very likely present at the Battle of the Severn. At some point after that he came into possession of Leonard's Neck where many of us reside today.

Henry Woolchurch, a Quaker, was among the first settlers to this area. An orphan, he was raised by the church and though probably not a Quaker when he originally came to the colonies, he converted and subsequently became a founder of the Third Haven Meeting House in Easton which is still operating today. Quakers were a Protestant sect who were persecuted by the English crown. They, like Catholics, were able to find a home in Maryland's more moderate religious climate.


Woolchurch divided Leonard's Neck between Alexander Gardiner and John Wray, creating two separate properties. Gardiner and Wray, both settlers from Virginia, were neighbors but it is unlikely that they were otherwise related. The portion of Leonard's Neck, including what is Goshen Farm today, was purchased from John Wray by John Pettebone Gardinerin 1754. More than one family named Gardiner had settled in Maryland at this time. The Gardiners of the Cape St. Claire area were different from the similarly named Gardiners of south county who have similar names, but whose history is more thoroughly documented. Many people lacked the ability to read or write, meaning much of their history is lost to time.

Alexander Gardiner's portion of Leonard's Neck included what is now the northern side of Cape St. Claire, and he passed his land onto his step sons. The step sons and their mother, Mary Gibbs, later gave some of the land to St. Margaret's Church. Interestingly, there is little evidence that Alexander Gardiner was directly related to John Pettebone Gardiner at all. This is why John Pettebone Gardiner ended up with John Wray's portion of the land, but Alexander Gardiner's portion passed to his heirs.

John Pettebone Gardiner was the son of Benjamin Gardiner and his wife Mary Pettebone. The Pettebones, a large local family with many prominent members, were also related to the Stinchcomb family. The Alfred Stinchcomb House on the Little Magothy sits on what was originally Pettebone property. In early America, few people had middle names. A middle name was both a sign of respect to another family and a display of relationship. Thus, John Pettebone Gardiner was immediately recognized as a member of both the Pettebone and Gardiner families.

In 1787, Richard Gardiner married Ann Merriken. They had at least five children, but only two, possibly three, survived to adulthood. The house that sits on what remains of Leonard's Neck, today Goshen Farm, was originally built by John Pettebone Gardiner's son, Richard Gardiner. The house was built sometime around 1783, making it over 230 years old.

So what does this say to us today? The house at Goshen Farm has witnessed over 230 years of history, and we are privileged to have it in our midst. As a piece of history, it should be cherished and preserved, which is what the GFPS is striving to accomplish. Please come visit us and be a part of our shared history.





Standard mosquito operating procedures – 2015

The Anne Arundel County & City of Annapolis Mosquito Control Program is conducted by the Mosquito Control Section of the Maryland Department of Agriculture, located in Annapolis, under cooperative agreement with the County and City Governments.

OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR SPRAYING OF ADULTICIDES (Treatment for adult mosquitoes):

- Regular Surveillance and Control of Adult Mosquitoes: June, 2015- September 2015 Sunday-Thursday (A night of the week will be assigned to your community)

 Anytime between 7:00 p.m.- 2:30 a.m.
- Spraying for adult mosquitoes will be done only if a Maryland Department of Agriculture Inspector determines it is necessary.
 - Spraying will not be conducted during rain, in wind speeds exceeding 12 MPH, or temperatures above 89°F.
 - Thresholds for Ground Based ULV Treatments:

Landing Counts: 3 mosquitoes in a 2 minute count

Light Trap Collections:
 12 female mosquitoes in an unbaited light trap

24 female mosquitoes in a baited light trap

Conditions that threaten public health, such as mosquito borne disease

• Adulticide Formulation

Permanone 30+30:

Permethrin mixed with Piperonyl Butoxide 0.0029 lbs/acre (Ultra Low

Volume application) and Mineral Oil

OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR SPRAYING OF LARVICIDES (Treatment for mosquito larvae):

- County-wide Surveillance and Control of Larval Mosquitoes: April October Monday – Friday, 8:00 AM -4:30 PM
- LARVICIDES TO BE USED:

Larvicide Formulations

Bacterial Larvicides:

Teknar, VectoBac and Aquabac:

Bacillus thuringiensis var. israelensis Granular, Liquid

 The Mosquito Control Program does not spray for Midges that swarm on homes, boats, trees and shrubs along many Anne Arundel County creeks and rivers. These non-biting insects develop in mud bottoms of slow moving water ways of low dissolved oxygen and will decline in numbers within a few weeks after they first appear.

We all know the kind of nuisance a large number of mosquitoes can be to our quality of life. In addition, they can carry many diseases like West Nile encephalitis, eastern equine encephalitis and St. Louis encephalitis.

Due to the large mosquito population in the Cape, we will once again be participating in the Community Mosquito Spraying Program by the Maryland Department of Agriculture for 2015. "The Department's preferred mosquito control strategy is the reduction of mosquito larvae numbers by source reduction, biological control agents or use of biological insecticides. Adult mosquito control, by ultra-low volume (ULV) application of insecticide, is conducted using aircraft or truck-mounted application equipment in residential areas for nuisance abatement and to protect public health from mosquito-borne disease." ~ source MDA's website

We just received the day of the week from the MDA which tell us what day spraying will take place. The day this year is **Wednesday nights between 7pm and 2:30am.** The 2015 program will begin with technician training on May 27 – June 10. During the training period our community might not be sprayed.

Regular season activity will begin by June 11 and continue into September, and possibly October


