Capers,

February has come and gone and a traditional winter looks less likely. Multiple times this month we have had beaches and parks full of kids playing on playgrounds, people picnicking and enjoying walks along the beach, while in short sleeve shirts and shorts, an odd sight for sure. We have March to go and there is always some wild weather to be expected, but March does bring us spring.

Spring breathes life back into Cape St. Claire and our calendars begin to be consumed with activities in the community, schools and sports to name few. The Annual Easter Egg Hunt on the Main Beach will be held on April 8th, look for work days to begin again around the CSC properties through the CSCIA, Cape Conservation Corps and the Cape Garden Club.

We have received a technical memo and guidance from Biohabitats, Inc. towards the next steps in our Capital Improvement Restoration and Renovation Project for our beaches at Lake Claire and Main Beach. We have shard this information for residents to review on our webpage and through our Facebook page here recently. This has us one step closer to preparing for submitting engineering designs and permits for our project.

Hopefully you saw our Facebook post late in February regarding us asking for resident help in contacting our State Senator and Delegates about the two bills we have before the General Assembly. We have two bills before the legislature, House Bill 567 and Senate Bill 115. If accepted and passed, these bills would help contribute funding to our project. The more funding we can get from the State, the less we will have to finance over the long term. You can follow along on our bills process this year online:

If you would take a moment to call/email/write members of the Anne Arundel County delegation, especially our members (Senator Ed Reilly, Delegates Michael Malone, Sid Saab, and Tony McConkey), your efforts would be deeply appreciated—and may even help our community save its beaches!!

I have some community housekeeping notes to mention.

- First, March 1st was the deadline for your Lot Maintenance fees for \$10.00. The late fee will be \$10.00 this year as previously announced. Stickers & Guest passes will be mailed out later this month and should be on your vehicles by May 1st, 2017. If you have more than two cars, additional stickers only cost \$5.00, which is a lot cheaper than the towing fees administered by our towing company once summer rolls around.
- Secondly, for those offered Pier Slips for 2017, please be sure to have your contracts, fees and all required items in before the March 31st, deadline. Please read your Cover Letters to ensure all items required are turned in together to avoid administrative processing fees.

Board In Brief cscIA Board Of Governors Monthly Meeting FEBRUARY 13, 2017

President Breeden called the meeting to order at 7:30 P.M. and thanked all for attending. He welcomed the new Board members and noted that this would be a transition month before a busy spring.

Guests in attendance were Lou Biondi of Goshen Farm and Becky Benner of the Garden Club.

The minutes of January 9, 2017 were approved.

The Profit & Loss Statement of December 31, 2016 was approved.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Treasurer: Governor Myers noted that Clubhouse and Caper income is higher than projected and that our finances are on track. She has been dealing with the county over a \$360 discrepancy in the budget.

Events: Governor Myers said work will begin on the July 4th events.

Communication & Technology: Governor Szczytko said the Caper is up on the web page, there has been a lot of work done on the piers database, and the piers contracts have been printed.

Caper: Governor Lamb said it's going well, with timely submissions and many ad requests.

Clubhouse: Governor Lamb noted the new floors and chairs in the Cox Meeting Room and said the next projects are work on the hall chairs and kitchen renovations.

Signboard: Governor Lamb said there have been problems with late submittals and she will work with Governor Szczytko to put timing guidelines on the web page.

Strawberry Festival: Governor Lamb reported plans are in full swing and the web page will be updated.

Easter Egg Hunt: Governor Lamb said plans are well underway.

Buildings: Governor Zadera said new items including homes and fences have been coming in.

Budget: Committee Chairman Buchet passed around a sheet explaining the budget timeline for new Board members and discussed the cap, the assessment, and surpluses.

BCC: Governor Breeden said the January 19 meeting focused on Bay Bridge traffic, Sandy Point, and increased police presence. More officers will be added from Memorial Day through Labor Day to deal with Sandy Point traffic, and 100 'No Parking" signs have been placed every 50 feet along East College Parkway to force illegally parked cars to move. Sandy Point may add an additional toll booth to speed up entry and highway alert signs all the way back to Washington will alert drivers when Sandy Point is full and closed. He mentioned that work will begin in the spring on making the Severn River

bridge 4 lanes east and 3 lanes west. The project could take 2 years to complete. The BCC continues to deal Bay Bridge funding, zoning, and the potential upzoning on East College Parkway.

BLOA: Work continues on their SCBD and letters have gone out indicating that county water is live and ready for hook up. There are no plans to connect the hydrant by the Shell station.

Covenants: Governor Breeden said there are 4 or 5 new issues that have come up.

Piers: Governor Breeden said that problems in the database from last year have been cleaned up. He noted that contracts run from February 1 to January 31 and are due back by April 1. Boats must be in by June 1 and moved at least 5 times before Labor Day. He continues to get help from the Piers Committee.

Security: Governor Breeden said that, other a minor breaking and entering, things have been quiet.

Beaches and Parks: Governor Breeden said that things are quiet and there is a request in for an Eagle Scout project in the parks.

Erosion Control: Governor Breeden will be meeting with Governor Vaccaro.

Personnel: Governor Breeden said there is a matter to deal with in Closed Session.

Roads: Governor Breeden got an update on Friday. Lines have been painted on Cape St. Claire Road from the middle of the shopping center to the firehouse. The work will be finished from the firehouse to the island next week, weather permitting. There is an 8 to 10 week delay in putting the street lights in. The dead trees have been marked and will come down in 3 weeks or so. There is some engineering and work to do on the step pools, and driveways, aprons, storm drains and sidewalks will be worked on in the next few weeks.

OLD BUSINESS

Governor Breeden mentioned HB567 and SB115, bond bills before the State Legislature for \$750,000 in matching funds for our beach restoration project. He and Governor Myers will be going to the State House on March 3 to make the case for the funds. He noted how much in taxes and other revenue the Cape contributes to the state and county and the fact that in 67 years we have never asked for anything back. There will be information on our website so that residents can contact our representatives by letter, email, or phone. The chances are we will not get all we ask for but we can submit bills every year.

Governor Breeden submitted the beach restoration project technical memo from Biohabitats to be added as an addendum to the minutes. The Board needs to review it and decide on the next steps. Given permit time frames, it will probably be

a year before actual work can begin. The technical memo will be posted on line for residents to review.

Governor Breeden also noted that surveying of our properties needs to happen before the restoration work begins. Beaches and Parks will be getting quotes to begin the work.

Governor Breeden met with the Garden Club to go over their re-organization and how they and the CSCIA can work together, especially with new plantings around the Clubhouse and work on the traffic islands. Budget Chairman Buchet brought up the issue of volunteer safety while working on the island.

NEW BUSINESS

Several damaged road signs were brought to Governor Lamb's attention. She noted that one had already been taken care of.

COMMENTS

Lou Biondi mentioned erosion and tree problems on Glenwood Dale. Governor Breeden will have the county look into it.

Lou Biondi also mentioned the Goshen Farm Java and Jazz event coming up on March 12, 2017 from 3 P.M. to 5 P.M. at

the Cape St. Claire Clubhouse. He said the Board of Education is coming to visit Goshen Farm and noted that they received an award for outstanding business partner from that Board.

Becky Benner noted that the Garden Club plant sale is May 20 in the Clubhouse fields and said the Garden Club meets on the first Tuesday of the month at 7 P.M. at the Clubhouse.

Administrative Assistant Coble mentioned that old building plans need to be scanned and organized.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned to a Closed Session at 8:44 P.M.


CLOSED SESSION



This program affords people the opportunity to see live wildlife, mostly native to Maryland, up close and personal. This informative and entertaining program uses live non-releasable birds of prey and reptiles to promote stewardship of our wildlife and other natural resources. Through the stories, or "tales" of how these animals come into the care of the program, Scales & Tales naturalists discuss very important environmental issues, such as loss of habitat, environmental pollution, resource management and biodiversity.

Scales and Tales also features Wildlife on Display. These displays feature several birds and reptiles exhibited in an informative and interactive manner. Naturalists are always on hand to answer questions and discuss the animals. Displays, featuring birds of prey and reptiles, also present plenty of children's activities, and the educational fun facts will delight everyone of all ages. Creating Biodiversity

"Examine each question in terms of what is ethically and esthetically right, as well what is economically expedient. A thing is right when it tends to preserve the integrity, stability and beauty of the biotic community. It is wrong when it tends otherwise." --Aldo Leopold. A Sand County Almanac

Have you ever considered your backyard as the last chance to sustain nature, create biodiversity and provide habitat? Or what your role is in preserving the natural world for future generations? We have a responsibility to be good stewards of our landscapes.

Our lawns, gardens and common spaces have always been expected to be a place of beauty, relaxation and an expression of ourselves and that the natural world existed somewhere else. Doug Tallamy, author of Bringing Nature Home states "We have always thought that biodiversity was happy somewhere out there in nature." We were never taught that species are disappearing everyday from our world and how their disappearance affects our own well-being.

Our bodies depend on biodiversity to support our own life systems. Biodiversity generates oxygen, cleans the water, creates topsoil, and acts as a buffer against extreme weather conditions. We cannot exist without the species that create our much needed ecosystems. The loss of habitat is one of the biggest threats to these much needed species. According to Tellamy, the area needed to sustain biodiversity is equal to the area that created it in the first place. If we lose 95% of our natural habits we can expect to lose 95% of species from that habitat.

While these facts and figures can be seem overwhelming and even hopeless Tellamy does not think it is too late to reverse the damage that we have done. There are steps we can take to prevent further damage and undo what has been done to our ecosystems.

What can you do as landowner and citizen of the community? Begin to think of your backyard as that place "out there". You can start by planting native plants and removing invasive species from your landscape. By doing so you will begin to create the habitat our native fauna needs to survive. You can provide everything wildlife needs right in your own backyard-food, water and shelter; you will be providing a place for biodiversity to exist. By planting natives you will attract beneficial bugs which in turn the birds will fed their young. Native plants and animals have co-evolved over thousands of years together and depend on each other for their survival. The insects have developed chemical relationships with the native plants and the plants provide those insects with the energy they need. A few nibbled leaves are not much of a sacrifice to our gardens to provide for the beneficial bugs lunch. They in turn will keep the "bad bugs" in check.

You can start small by choosing an area to remove invasives such as English ivy, Japanese honeysuckle, and oriental bittersweet and replanting with native woody and herbaceous plants. When adding more plants to your garden this spring chooses natives over exotics. They will support many more species of caterpillars. Those caterpillars become food for baby birds or if they survive, beautiful butterflies and moths. You can also make a difference to help conserve native natural areas in your community by becoming involved in community groups that are working towards preserving our wild world.

Conservation of our ecosystems starts out there-in our own backyard and community spaces. We can and should make a difference in preserving and protecting biodiversity.

It is important to plant for a continuous bloom season. Here is a list of plants grouped by the season they bloom in. Be sure to check soil conditions and light requirements to choose the right plants for the right areas in your yard

The sharp contrasts of black and white between a seed pod and the stem to soft snow collecting on the slight twigs of woodland sunflower there is wonder to be found in the winter scene. You won't see the bold flashes of color the spring and summer show us or the crisp autumn foliage but if you head the call to leave those stalks standing you might just be surprised by the beauty all around in the whispers of color.
