Board In Brief CSCIA Board Of Governors Monthly Meeting APRIL 10, 2017

President Breeden called the meeting to order at 7:32 P.M. He welcomed guests from the Garden Club and a Cape resident. He noted that we are moving into our busy season with covenants, buildings, piers, beaches and parks, and Clubhouse renovations.

A resident presented her case for a side setback variance to 7 feet instead of 10. The owner has county approval, has had the required community hearing and has a survey. The Board said they would vote on the matter in a closed session tonight.

Governor Zadera brought up another variance request that had been made to locate a shed closer to a property line to remain in compliance with the requirement to be at least 20 feet from a well. The county has approved this and the Board will vote on the matter in closed session tonight.

The minutes of March 13, 2017 were approved with a correction to Governor Myers' statement in Old Business regarding our bond bill request.

The Profit & Loss Statement of February 28, 2017 were approved. President Breeden noted that there will be big changes to the Piers figures now that slip fees are coming in.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Clubhouse: Governor Lamb is working with the Garden Club on replanting around the Clubhouse. There will be no invasive species. She has also talked with a contractor about kitchen and bathroom renovations.

Caper: Governor Lamb said the Caper is going strong and is fully funded. The June issue will be a coupon issue for local businesses.

Signboard: Governor Lamb said that the location of the Cape welcome sign needs to be addressed in conjunction with the placement of a new signboard.

Strawberry Festival: Governor Lamb said planning was in full swing and she added that the Easter egg hunt was a big success.

Technology: Governor Szczytko said the Caper has been posted, the Strawberry Festival site is up and being worked on, and he continues to work on the Piers database. He fixed the office computer backups.

Buildings: Governor Zadera said that things are coming in and he's working on taking care of everything electronically with the forms and the residents. There was discussion of having a company begin scanning in building plans and documents as a trial run.

Budget: Chairman Buchet said that it's time for the Board to start letting the Budget Committee know what will be needed next year, as the committee will begin meeting soon.

Erosion Control: Governor Vaccaro said that Youth Sailing wants to plant beach grasses to the right of the Lake Claire crabbing pier. It will need to be discussed with Governors Breeden and Macindoe. She said she has a burn permit for April 23, with an April 30 backup date.

Events: Governor Fairchild said plans for July 4th are in full

swing and the parade permit has been applied for.

Covenants: Governor Roche said are about 20 issues on the books, with some of them being old cases active with the county.

Treasurer: Governor Myers has been in contact with the county and with DNR trying to find clarification on the issue of whether or not we need a shore erosion control district in order to secure a less expensive loan for our restoration project. She reiterated that, while our bond request was turned down this year, we did get attention for next year's funding cycle.

BCC: Governor Breeden said there will be a transportation forum at the Clubhouse on April 20 at 7:30 P.M. There will be multiple speakers discussing a variety of issues. Information will be on our web site and Facebook page.

BLOA: Governor Breeden said they are moving along on getting their SCBD for hooking up water. He also said there have been comments and questions about the size of the handicap parking spots.

Piers: Governor Breeden said that piers season is in full swing. Water is going on at Deep Creek and Lake Claire this weekend. He said 28 slips are changing hands and mud slips are filling up.

Security: Governor Breeden said things have been quiet in our beaches and parks but there was a big theft of sports equipment from Cape recreation. He said warm weather brings more vandalism and urged residents to lock their homes and vehicles.

OLD BUSINESS

Governor Breeden noted the new street lights on Cape St. Claire Road, the improved speed bumps and the new crosswalks. He said discussions are ongoing regarding the step pools and the Hilltop/Little Magothy/Cape St. Claire intersection.

Governor Breeden said we will be contracting with a new towing company.

Governor Breeden said anyone over 18 years old can apply for a beach attendant job by emailing parks@cscia.org by April 30. This will also be mentioned on our Facebook page.

Governors Breeden and Macindoe will be working on Eagle Scout projects.

There was lengthy discussion on Biohabitats' report and moving ahead to the next stages of our beach restoration project.

There was discussion on moving ahead with a town manager position by putting together a job description and beginning the process of posting the job and seeking applicants. We would like to be able to update residents at the April membership meeting. There was further discussion of just how a town manager would work with the Board and whether any by-law changes might be needed.

Governor Vaccaro noted that it is invasive spraying season and she would like to work on the reclaimed ravines along Lake Clair Drive. She has some grant money for maintaining the Little Magothy rain garden. She said she believes all the

phragmites at Lake Claire have been dealt with and would like to start on the ones at the inlet.

NEW BUSINESS

Vaccaro said someone is looking to make a concrete mosaic bench in memory of her husband to place in the middle ravine on Lake Clair Drive. Governor Breeden said that would be a Beaches and Parks decision. She also said she would like to put up an interpretive sign at the Little Magothy rain garden. Governor Breeden said she would have to check with county about permits and placement.

Governor Fairchild brought up the idea of adding a ticketed evening beach event to watch July 4th fireworks. There was some discussion which ended up concluding that, for a variety of reasons, this would not be feasible.

Governor Szczytko said he had thought that paying maintenance fees on line would be the way to go, but that available plug ins are not going to work. He asked if we wanted to create my.cscia.org as a way of allowing people to pay bills, reserve signboard and Clubhouse, and access forms on line. He noted that we will still have to allow people to do things the old-fashion way, as well. There was discussion of future maintenance, costs and security of such a system.

Governor Breeden brought up the annual request from Broadneck Grill to use two parking spaces for serving food and drink during Cinco de Mayo. A motion was made and approved to grant the request.

Governor Breeden brought up an issue that was raised by a local realtor, in which she noted that the county and state assessors have designated 95% of Cape St. Claire housing as below average. This affects the ability to get mortgages, and affects sales prices and property values. The county and state will not provide any criteria for their determination of grade, but we need to understand what is going on and let residents know how this is affecting them. A motion was made and approved to have the Board investigate the county and state rating system.

COMMENTS

Becky Benner and Larry Jennings of the Garden Club noted that their annual plant sale will take place in the Clubhouse field on May 20. These are all locally raised plants and the sale is the Club's main fund raiser. They also said the Club will begin Clubhouse landscaping on Wednesday.

ADJOURNMENT


The meeting was adjourned to a Closed Session at 9:13 P.M.

HISTORIC GOSHEN FARM AND EDUCATIONAL CENTER

GOSHEN FARM RECOGNIZED AS COMMUNITY BUSINESS PARTENER

The Goshen Farm Preservation Society has been selected as a 2017 Excellence in Education Business Partner of the Year. These awards are given by the Anne Arundel County Chamber of Commerce. Board members, Louis Biondi, Sharon Biondi, and Terry Brandon and GFPS member, Susan Brandon attended the awards dinner at the BWI Marriott Hotel on April 26, 2017. It was an exciting evening during which the Chamber honored a teacher of the year for private and public schools, and recognized the Society's business excellence and its dedicated efforts in making a difference in Anne Arundel County schools. The letter of invitation from Bob Burdon, President-CEO of the Chamber read, in part, "Thank you for your commitment to our schools and community. Your efforts inspire students as our future workforce, and your businesses help promote commerce and quality of life in our region."

In 2016, the Society received similar recognition from the 21st Century Education Foundation. Both awards were the result of nominations put forth by Michelle L. Weisgerber, Signature Program Facilitator, Environmental Literacy, Broadneck High School.

SOAR LIKE AN EAGLE

April saw the completion of two more Eagle Scout Service Projects at Goshen Farm. The first was the planning, designing, constructing, and installing of a sign near the intersection of Radoff Road (the name of our driveway) and Cape St. Claire Road. Steven Engel and a large group of fellow Scouts and parents installed the sign on Saturday

March 18, 2017. It reads, "Historic Goshen Farm & Education Center." It also includes our address number at the top (1420) and a place to hang an "OPEN" sign at the bottom during our events.

The second project was undertaken by Sean Powers, son of Board Member, Scott Powers. The new "History Trail" was designed and constructed by Sean and his fellow Scouts and runs from the entrance gate to Goshen Farm to the field behind the tenant house at the top of the hill. Sean has worked many the Society's Open Houses as a traffic and parking control volunteer. He noticed some visitors came on foot and walked up the hill, putting them on a very narrow road with the cars. He proposed his project as a safety measure and added an interesting twist. Along the trail are markers that describe significant events during Goshen Farm's 230-year history.

The Society wants to thank Patrick Marsh who has volunteered to assist Roy Benner, the Goshen Farm Grounds' Chair, in overseeing Eagle Scouting Service Projects.

IT IS ONLY A DIVERSION

Last year Goshen Farm was awarded a grant from Constellation Energy to install a system of water diversion structures along the driveway to prevent the runoff that creates ruts in the drive. The structures are made of pressure treated lumber and conveyor belt rubber. They are buried in the roadway with several inches of the rubber protruding above the road. This allows the water to be diverted to the desired area off the road, yet allows vehicle to safely

travel over the structure. Grounds Chair, Roy Benner, with assistance from Bob Nestruck and Larry Jennings, installed those structures last month during a "Work Day at the Farm." Roy and his team used the newly donated single blade plow and the trusty Goshen Farm tractor to dig the trenches for installing the structures.

"Work Day at the Farm" also included a complete washing and cleaning of the floors, walls, and ceilings in the house in preparation for the open house. This clean up, conducted semi-annually, is designed to mitigate any dust and mold build-up. Building & Maintenance Chair, David McCormick, with the help of Lou and Sharon Biondi and Linda Beck lead the cleanup effort.

ON THE MOVE

The last major project finished in April was the move of the apiary from the lower field to the field behind the tenant house. Grounds Chair, Roy Benner, moved the fence and

sign and beekeepers Jenni Biondi and Erik Wallace picked up and installed the new hives. Hopefully the new locations will improve the hive survival rate.



Alternatives to Mosquito Control

Anyone that has spent a summer in Cape St Claire knows we have mosquitoes. Living near the water is often blamed for the infestation each summer, but most of the mosquitoes come right from your own backyard. Mosquitoes don't travel far so it is important to survey your yard and see what you can do to prevent their arrival in the first place. Mosquitoes need suitable aquatic breeding habitats to complete their life cycle. Eliminate any sources of stagnant water where the mosquitoes can lay and grow their eggs and stop them before they lay the eggs. Water can accumulate in bird baths, old tires, rain barrels, ponds, ditches, flower pots, roof gutters and unused swimming pools or covers. There are several things you can do: change your bird baths every couple of days, empty and overturn any vessels where water can sit in, use screens on your rain barrels, pull covers and tarps taut and enlist the help of good bugs and other natural predators in your backyard ponds. Water also accumulates in dense patches of English Ivy so consider removing this highly invasive plant to reduce mosquito breeding grounds.

There are several natural ways to stop mosquitoes from hatching if they do happen to breed in an undetected water source in your yard. The essential oils found in many plants and herbs can be used to repel mosquitoes including Catmint, Peppermint, Lemon, Lavender, Eucalyptus, Thyme, Geranium, Clove, Sage, Cinnamon, and Rosemary. You can plant them in pots or in the ground near areas of your yard where people gather. You can also throw some thyme or rosemary bundles on the bar-b-que when you are grilling to repel them. A few non-herb plants to use are ageratum, an easy to grow old fashioned annual, and marigolds. Be sure to crush the leaves of the plants to activate the oils in the leaves otherwise the mosquitoes won't smell them. You can also add a few drops of essential oils to coconut or olive oil and then dab a few drops on your skin. Cedar oil is also a natural mosquito repellant. CedarCide makes a spray bottle called YardSafe for spraying areas of your yard. Or for a cheaper option or broader area use garlic oil (both can be found on Amazon). Both products are natural, non-toxic alternatives for outdoor pest control.

Consider installing a backyard, no-fuss wildlife pond in your landscape. I know it sounds crazy to ask you to add water when I just finished saying get rid of your water but hear me out. A well balanced wildlife pond will act as a natural LARVAECIDE unit if you DO NOT include fish. Let dragonflies lay their babies (nymphs) in the pond and they will feast on the larvae of the mosquitoes. You may have to scoop a few swimmers out until the dragonflies get established. The nymphs will grow into big strong dragonflies that will then eat any mosquitoes that did hatch. If you introduce fish they will eat the larvae as well but they will also eat nymphs, frog and toad eggs and salamander eggs. If you want a biodiverse, ecologically sound pond skip the fish and rely on the Mother Nature to do the work. You could add a small solar pump for circulation but it is not necessary. The key to attracting dragonflies is a safe, comfortable environment. A small pond with a shallow end, plenty of vegetation and some flat rocks around it will work fine. The rocks act as a resting

place for the adult dragonflies to lie in the sun, waiting for the adult mosquitoes to leave the pond. For more information on building a backyard pond check out this website:


Another natural enemy of the mosquito is the bat. Some bat species eat 500-1000 mosquitoes each night. There are many easy to install bat houses you can hang or easy step-by-step instructions on how to make your own. Attracting bats to your property is a fun way to keep mosquitoes at bay. It may take several years for the bats to find and inhabit your box but a few tips to make your house more inviting: make sure it receives 6-7 of direct sunlight, faces SE to SW direction, should be 2' tall and 14" wide. ¾'1" partitions, ¼" ventilation, preferably located ¼ mile from water, and 20-25 ft from the nearest tree.

What should you not do to combat mosquitoes in your yard? Do not spray pesticides. There are several backyard mosquito spraying companies will try to convince you that the insecticides containing pyrethroids are a safe alternative to other insecticides but the consequences to our beneficial insects, fish and tadpoles is deadly. These sprays do not distinguish between mosquitoes and beneficial bugs. Ladybugs, preying mantis, honeybees and native bees that land on a surface that has been sprayed all die. The runoff from our yards containing the pyrethroids ends up in our streams and rivers with enough concentration to kill off the small aquatic life that is crucial to fish and other aquatic animals. The sprays are typically active for 21 days, which means that children and pets running around on a treated lawn are also coming into contact with these chemicals.

Many known health problems are associated with using pesticides and insecticides. We continue to use them because they have been so widely used for so many years that many people assume they are safe. This is just not the case. Not only are they harmful to human health but to our natural world as well. When you apply pesticides to kill mosquitoes and other unwanted insects you're killing the beneficial bugs as well. These insects are needed to pollinate our food, grow our beautiful gardens and provide food for baby birds. Please think twice this summer before using these deadly pesticides and try a safer approach.

CAPE COLLEGE COUNSELING

Anyone counting on merit aid--on grants and scholarships awarded regardless of need-- should take the following to heart.

- Grades matter most. And though high school may look like 8 semesters spread over 4 years, for the college-bound it's more like 6 semesters over 3. Think of our rising seniors who'll be applying early in the fall. First-semester grades won't appear on their transcripts until next February, well after the Early-Action notification date. Second-semester results won't be posted until well after the admissions deposit deadline of May 1. So the grades juniors are earning right now could well be the last set an admissions committee will see before deciding their fate. By this timetable, a sophomore's college transcript will be 2/3 compete come June, not 1/2. Now is the time, kids!
- Flexibility is key in the search for merit aid. "We're looking for a generous scholarship" and "We're not applying to any school more than 2 hours from our house," are inconsistent statements. Don't work against yourself by being arbitrary.
- Don't hem yourself in geographically. The Midwest is dotted with colleges that will start you off with a smaller price tag than their coastal competitors. So is the South. A reputable college counselor can help you find such places. Why not take a look and see what's out there?
- In the quest for merit aid, stay flexible on matters of size, make a visit, and see for yourself if the school could work. (You'd be surprised how a nice scholarship can shrink a school that seemed to big, or expand one that looked too small!)
- The reality is that financial aid works in ways that are counterintuitive. What looks more expensive may well turn out not to be so. What's the cost differential between a state school that runs 25K a year and makes no award, and a private college that costs 50K but comes up with 25K in aid? Suggestion: Try both types and see how you do.
- We may "know what we like", but it's also true that we like what we already know. There are fine schools out there you may not have heard of. Don't dismiss. Be open to possibility!
- College lists consisting of a bunch of hyper-selective schools accompanied by a single unwanted "safety" aren't helpful. Reach, don't flail. That ugly duckling you have no intention of attending provides no safety at all. In the end, Teddy Roosevelt had it right: "Keep your eyes on the stars, and your feet on the ground."
- Find some joy in the process. There are awesome schools out that are relative "bargains" in this crazy market. Please let me know if I can help you find one!
