Lastly, I want to welcome our newest Governor, Joe Angel, who was elected at our annual meeting. We look forward to having new energy on the Board of

Governors as we move forward. A quick thanks to Mary Lamb for volunteering for I believe an 8th or 9th consecutive term, serving the community now for nearly 25 years. I was reelected to a 4th term, having served the last 9 years on the board, and have been elected by the Board to serve a sixth term as President for 2022.

We will spend the next few weeks transitioning while we oversee the ongoing Beach Restoration Project. Things are going really well, our major funding is all secured and in hand, all permits approved, and all work expected to be completed at both Sites 1 & 2 by February 15th. We look forward to celebrating the successful completion of these projects in the spring, when we hopefully can all enjoy warmer weather outdoors.

Board In Brief CSCIA Board Of Governors Monthly Meeting JANUARY 10, 2022

In attendance online: President Jeff Roche, Govs Beau Breeden, Neil Macindoe, Cheri Fairchild, Michele Shipley, Dawn Myers, Bill Szczytko, Lisa Schmidt and Mary Lamb, Town Manager Ryan Anderson, budget committee member Charlie Moore and guests Becky Benner, Stacy Wildberger, Bob Bishop, Steve Arnold, Anna Arnold, Brad Knopf, Bill Rappaport and Michael Travers.

President Roche called the online meeting to order at 7:32 pm. He thanked all for attending, adding that it has been a busy month with holidays, snow days, Covid and the beach project.

MINUTES AND FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Minutes of the December 13, 2021 BOG meeting were reviewed, a motion to approve and passed unanimously.

The financial statement for November 2021 was reviewed, a motion to approve and passed unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Beaches and Parks: Gov Breeden reported he and Gov Macindoe will ensure that posted rules and regulations are consistent among the website and beach/pier properties.

Broadneck Council of Communities: Gov Breeden announced the meeting with the state highway administration to discuss access roads, Bay Bridge project, Sandy Point Park and traffic with a possible national park will be held in Feb. He will attend the Stakeholders Advisory Comm. meeting for the Broadneck area on Jan 24 and get info on items such as polls for residents on priorities for the area.

Budget: Gov Breeden said that the budget committee can use new members and if any residents are interested in learning more about the community and how it operates, the budget committee is a great way to be involved and learn.

Building: President Roche said he and co-chair Gov Shipley will address the backlog of applications.

Caper: Gov Lamb said the Caper was posted online timely but mailed later than expected.

Clubhouse: Gov Lamb reported rental cancellations and she will see how mandates change before deciding on restrictions.

Events: Gov Lamb announced the next event is the Easter egg hunt. She has not received any information on the Cape Cleanup.

Piers: Gov Breeden reported the Deep Creek pier project is complete. Contracts will be sent to slip holders at the end of the month.

Security: Gov Breeden said that one officer was out with Covid.

Strawberry Festival: Gov Lamb said planning is going strong.

Technology: Gov Szczytko reported website updates and

posting of the Caper. Subscription to the email blasts is over 125 people.

Town Manager- Town Mgr. Anderson reported snow damage to trees. Richard's Tree Care cleared downed branches and took down badly damaged trees and a dead tree that had been slated for removal. He and Gov Breeden will attend the Feb 10 court hearing regarding a trespassing incident. The 2nd invoice for herbicide spraying at the Serene Ravine was passed to the Cape Conservation Corps. A location is to be chosen for the educational sign for the beach project. It might be added to the original permit as a minor modification instead of requiring a new permit. The \$44,000 principal payment on the project loan will be auto drafted Feb 13. Funds have been set aside for monthly interest payments. Letters for renewal have been sent to slip holders and new contracts are due Mar 18. Some boat owners do not renew their DNR registrations before sending in contracts. An administrative fee is charged for incomplete contracts. The piers waitlist is 92 people. The gate lock at the Little Magothy pier is having intermittent issues that the locksmith is working on. The Lake Claire lock will be replaced in the spring. There is still no answer regarding the Site 2 fee in lieu of for underwater vegetation removal fees for a spur dredge at Deep Creek. Walsh and Son completed replacement of 11 pilings and about 100 feet of ledgers, stringers and decking at the Deep Creek pier. The project was planned for fiscal year 21 (FY21) so financial reports will show the expenditure in FY22, but funds were available from the prior budget year. He will work with Gov Szczytko to correct document sharing issues. One security officer has been off the schedule, and one was out possibly with Covid. Outdoor dining was extended until Jan 2023. There was snowstorm tree damage at the Swim Club. Trees and bamboo were removed by Richard's. Insurance policies were renewed, and premiums paid, with only a slight increase (<2%) to the liability policy. Ballots for voting on governors and the budget must be turned in by the start of the Annual Meeting. Maintenance fee postcards were taken to the post office Dec 30th but very few residents have received them.

OLD BUSINESS

Gov Breeden said the latest phase of the Site 1 beach project began with approximately 1200 yd3 of sand dredged from the Little Magothy River spread on the main beach. It has created excitement and people have visited the beach to watch the progress. The beach remains closed, please stay safely behind the construction fencing. While waiting for final permits, work moved to Site 2. The tidal wetlands modification was approved Jan 5 so work will shift back to the cobble bar and groin, which must be completed by the Jan 21st deadline. If weather and tides continue to be an issue, we can apply for extensions. Work not completed by Feb 15th must be postponed until October. Site 2 will be restarted once Site 1 work ends. He noted that coordinating the many departments of the county,

state and Army Corps of Engineers has been difficult, especially with Covid causing the closure of physical offices and reliance on emails for most communication. It is hoped work will be done in Feb, with replanting to occur in the spring. Gov Breeden added that the \$250,000 bond bill check was received. He is working on the process for the other \$250,000 allocated by the state. Our \$975,000 portion of the contract with Alliance of the Chesapeake has been completed and expected costs are within \$357 of the original contract. It includes about \$72,000 for contingencies. The contract end date was extended from 12/31/2021 into 2022. President Roche reiterated the difficulties in acquiring the bond bill check and thanked Gov Breeden for his tenacity and for navigating the system.

NEW BUSINESS No new business was discussed.

COMMENTS

Stacy Wildberger reported the invoice for herbicide spraying was paid by Cape Conservation Corps (CCC). They will be weeding at the rain garden at the Little Magothy Beach and Serene Ravine. She will ask for permission to plant ground cover near the rain garden at Little Magothy beach and apply for a Unity Garden grant for funding. A Watershed Steward candidate who grew up in the Cape and would like to continue the work at Deep Creek. Mrs. Wildberger will help her plan for an October event to remove invasive species and plant native. Broadneck Grill will have a CCC fundraiser on Jan 19 from 5-9

Becky Benner reported Goshen Farm is installing fencing for a children's nature play space. It will feature attractions for children aged 3-8 such as logs, tunnels, play sand boat, and mud pie table. For Maryland Day, a statewide event scheduled for Mar 25-27, a limited number of farmhouse tour tickets will be available. The Java & Jazz, Teas & Tunes event is planned for Mar 13 at the clubhouse.

Becky Benner reported the Garden Club Feb meeting will be held virtually and feature a guest speaker, landscaper and horticulturist Claire Jones, to discuss seed sowing and vegetable garden/ cutting garden prep. They are hoping for a workshop in March.

ADJOURNMENT & CLOSED SESSION

A motion was made to move to closed session and approved unanimously at 8:11 pm. A closed session was convened at 8:13 pm and adjourned at 9:07 pm. The regular session of the January 10, 2022 meeting was adjourned at 9:07 pm.

A Message from The Town Manager

Happy New Year !!! Welcome back to all of our re-elected Board of Governors and a special congratulations to our new President and Vice President, Beau Breeden and Mary Lamb! Both Beau and Mary have been board members for quite awhile and I am confident they will lead CSCIA in the right direction in the year to come. Thank you to President Jeff Roche for his outstanding leadership over the past year. Jeffl successfully led us through some trying times of litigation and historic firsts with our beach restoration projects.

Everyone should be receiving their annual maintenance fee renewal forms in the mail. Keep a lookout for the yellow postcards and be sure to pay your maintenance fee by March 1st to avoid any late fees. You can mail a check in or come by the office M-F 8:30-2:30 or use the dropbox outside of the office door. We accept cash and checks payable to CSCIA. If you wish to receive parking stickers and vehicle hang-tag passes, you must provide your vehicle information on the postcard.

With recent mail delays occurring, piers contracts were sent out early. Fees are due by March 18th. If you would like to apply to become a slip holder, the link to the application, rules, and waitlist can all be found here.

With the new yardarm attached to the flagpole at the Main Beach it will allow us to fly the Yacht Club of Cape St. Claire burgee or any other appropriate pennants. We are hoping to reestablish our annual sock burning bonfire sometime in April if conditions allow for it. Unfortunately before we can get to spring boating weather we have to finish out with the remaining winter. Please be prepared for the worst.

Snow Removal Tips

• Shovel snow before it gets packed down or endures a freezethaw cycle, because it gets a lot harder to remove if you wait.

- DO NOT move snow into the street. It could potentially be plowed right back onto the areas you just cleared. Deposit snow on the front yard or in areas away from the street and sidewalks.
- While you're out there, don't forget to shovel out the fire hydrant. In the event of a house fire, firefighters should spend those precious minutes protecting your house, not shoveling out the fire hydrant. Help them protect your property by keeping hydrants clear. Keep Your Pipes from Freezing
- Water pipes can freeze in mere hours with sub-freezing weather, especially if they're exposed to cold air or drafts. To help prevent an expensive water pipe break:
- Disconnect water hoses from outside faucets and protect faucets with an insulated cover.
- During extended sub-freezing cold periods, open cabinets in low-heat areas where plumbing is located.
- Install insulation blocks in crawl space vents.
- Check pipes near exterior walls and in crawl spaces. Add insulation if they are exposed.
- Set the thermostat at a minimum of 55° during cold weather, even if the house is vacant.
- Winterize all irrigation systems.
- Snow on the ground insulates underground plumbing better than no snow.
- Keep a plumber's number handy!

Citizens can access the system by simply dialing 3-1-1 for all municipal services. Operators are available from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. Please dial 9-1-1 for emergencies and medical assistance. Citizens can also download the mobile app through the App Store (iPhone) and Google Play (Android). Only a simple signup process is required. Just hit the magnifying glass and search for "Arundel 311."

The mobile platform, through the See-Click-Fix application, allows citizens to report a lost pet, a pothole, a missed trash collection, traffic signs, illegal signs, and many other issues. Using your mobile device, you can take a picture, set a location, and receive updates on the response to your issue.



Native Evergreens Offer Year Round Interest By: Stacey Wildberger

Looking out the winter window can sometimes be depressing if you haven't planned for a winter landscape. There are several things you can do that will give your eye something to feast upon in the dead of the winter. The first thing you need to do is re-think pretty and learn to appreciate the beauty in the brown. Leaving your stems stand throughout the winter, resisting the urge to cut everything down to the ground in the fall will create interest. The brown seed heads are something to behold, especially when the snow comes and clings to them. Another step you can take is to plant some native evergreens in your gardens to create interest. The color green in various shades to break up the browns will offer a stimulating view. Here are a few that will be native to us.

Ilex opaca American Holly is beautiful evergreen, fruiting tree reaching heights of 25-60' high. The bright red berries appear on the female (you need a male nearby to get fruit) that is devoured by many song birds from robins, cardinals and even cedar waxwings.

Magnolia grandilflora Southern magnolia is a broadleaf flowering evergreen that will reach 60-80' in height and offers a fragrant white bloom in spring that will look beautiful in the winter sky.

Juniperus virginiana Eastern red cedar one of my favorite evergreen trees because the blackish-green berries attract one of my favorite birds, the cedar waxwing! From the berries to the horizontal evergreen branches to the reddish-brown exfoliating bark this 30-65' tree will create a site to behold throughout the winter.

Ilex glabra inkberry is a broadleaf shrub growing 5-8' in height and producing a dark ink colored berry attractive to many birds as well. It can used as a shrub border and allow to naturalize, creating a barrier and nesting area for many birds as well.

All the way down at the ground level we find my favorite year round evergreen ground cover *Packera aurea* golden ragwort. These evergreen basal leaves will stay green throughout most if not all the winter in our region, creating not only an effective weed control but a refreshing green carpet to feast our eyes on a drab winter day. The plant will throw up a spike in early spring and be one of the first bloomers. The bright yellow flower will make you smile as the garden is beginning to wake up from its winter nap.

There are several other groundcover plants that will hold their color throughout the winter and offer the same weed suppression. *Penstemon digitalis* foxglove beardtongue, *Heuchera americana* coral bells, *Tiarella cordifolia* foamflower, *Phlox subulata* Moss phlox, *Chrysogonum virginianum* green and gold and even the common violets *Viola sp.* that many of us pull up and consider weeds are a beautiful evergreen presence in the garden and a wonderful host plant to the fritillary butterfly in the spring.
