Board In Brief CSCIA Board Of Governors Monthly Meeting

APRIL 7, 2025

In attendance in person: Pres. Jerome Zadera, Govs. Joe Angel, Beau Breeden, Cheri Fairchild, Ed Hayes, Mary Lamb, Blake Morris, Neil Macindoe, and Michele Shipley, Town Manager Frank Tewey, Budget Comm. member Trey Meeks, and guests Becky Benner, Charlie Corliss, Joe DeCesaris, Dave Draper, Alisha Donahue, Keith Donahue, Kellen Moore, Ryan Moore, Jennifer Sowles, San Sowles, Aaron West, Kyle West, and Stacey Wildberger.

Pres. Zadera called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm and announced the Quarterly Membership meeting on Apr. 23.

BUILDING VARIANCE

Town Manager Tewey introduced variance requests. The owners of the first property are requesting a 4 ft variance to the 25 ft front setback for a deck and explained limitation due to the neighbor's wellhead, a steep grade, the rise/run codes for stairs, and the angle of the property. The builder for the second property explained the request for a variance to the setback. Depending on what is considered the front of the house changes what amount of variance is needed to place a wall 7 ft from the property line. The county has approved both plans. Both requests will be discussed in the closed session and Mr. Tewey will inform the homeowners of the decisions.

SCOUT PROJECTS

Eagle Scout candidate Kellen Moore of Troop 783 introduced his proposal to build a worktable for the oyster nursery at the Little Magothy pier area. Mr. Moore would like to build a sturdy onsite table. Oyster cages could be stored under the table. He will restore/rebuild existing nursery signage. 84 Lumber will donate building materials and Broadneck Grill is hosting a fundraiser night. Mr. Moore noted that per critical area restrictions, the table will not be set in the ground but will have rubber feet to protect the wood. Dave Draper introduced the kayak rack expansion project. Kayak racks are at 4 beaches. Rental fees go to the Youth Sailing program. Kayaks were removed to allow for maintenance and to determine which slots might be available to the waitlist. Some rentals will not be renewed by the current users. He plans to gain slots without doing anything that would require permits. Eagle Scout candidate Alisha Donahue described her proposal to connect the existing three racks at Lake Claire to utilize space between them to create 15 new kayak slots. She will seek donation of materials and has fundraising ideas. These projects will be discussed in closed session and Mr. Tewey will inform the Scouts of the decisions. Mr. Draper was thanked for his leadership. He will reach out to the waitlist to ask for assistance with similar work at other locations. He hopes to add 30 new slots.

MINUTES AND FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Minutes of the March 10, 2025, BOG meeting were reviewed. A motion to accept the minutes passed unanimously.

The financial statements for Feb. were reviewed. Balances of the bank accounts on Feb. 28 were approximately: Operating funds/Grants: \$355,000, piers-\$300,700 and Special Community Benefits District (SCBD)-\$289,100. The motion to approve passed unanimously.

TOWN MANAGER REPORT – Frank Tewey

Maintenance fees were due Mar. 1 and slip rental contracts were due Mar. 15. Thanks to Matt Cox for his work with piers.

Cape St Claire was approved for the Maryland mosquito spraying program. Spraying will be done on Monday nights as needed. Forms for opting out are available online and in the office, and at the Quarterly Membership meeting. See the Apr. 4 Facebook post for more info.

The first Budget Committee meeting will be held May 1 at 7pm. Officers are covering 20 of 30 days in April. Crime reports included 9 calls in Feb. and 11 calls in Mar. No patterns to be concerned about. The chain link fence behind the clubhouse will be installed soon by Fence and Deck Connection. Contracts for Deep Creek piers and bulkhead are being reviewed by attorneys. Due to permitting issues, the work will be postponed until after the boating season. Portable restrooms were delivered to the main beach, Deep Creek and Lake Claire. Additional ones will be delivered in May. The entrance sign on Cape St Claire Rd is peeling and the sign manufacturer was asked for a repair estimate. Twenty-two of the beach attendants from 2024 will be returning. The Beach Attendant meeting will be on May 17. Attendants will be on duty at Deep Creek only for May 20/21 for the Blue Angels performances. Beach coverage will run from May 23- Sept 1.

An administrative hearing will be held for a variance for less setback than required for a second story addition and a garage with second story living space. Four standard building applications will be reviewed. Two carryover submittals are pending because county variances were denied. A pier agreement is awaiting homeowner signature. The county posted a stop work order and a field correction notice for a shed without permits. Mr. Tewey has been monitoring legislation that could affect CSCIA and nothing has passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Broadneck Council of Communities (BCC): Gov. Breeden reported that Department of Public Works (DPW) representative Karen Henry gave a good presentation on all projects on the Broadneck Peninsula. County Councilwoman Amanda Fiedler discussed legislative issues at the county level. The Apr. 24 meeting will include the Maryland Transportation Authority and State Highway Administration to discuss plans for 2025 Bay Bridge traffic studies and updates on bridge replacement plans.

Caper: Gov. Lamb reported the Caper is arriving in mailboxes now and has been online since the 1st of April.

Clubhouse: Gov. Lamb said rentals remain strong and she is getting estimates regarding replacement door locks.

Events: Gov. Lamb announced the Easter Egg Hunt will be held April 12 with Kona Ice available. The last clue of the virtual egg hunt will be given April 8. Permits are pending for the July 4 parade, and no rain date permit will be issued.

Piers: Gov. Breeden said about 25 people attended the first pier's meeting. Water will be turned on about Apr. 15 and repairs made as needed to have water available as soon as possible. Electrical upgrades are to be done by the Jun. 1 deadline to have boats in slips. Some mudslips will be open after the moves are completed. Mar. preliminary financials show most of the pier's income has been received.

Strawberry Festival: Gov. Lamb said permits are all in place and plans are going well.

Help your Cape ambassadors! Our Beach Attendants will begin duties this month. They are tasked with providing Cape residents with an enjoyable day at our beaches and marinas. They will monitor parking areas to ensure Cape residents and permitted guests have exclusive use of community lots and they will verify eligibility of those entering our Community parks and beaches. Your cooperation is truly appreciated! If you have any questions, just ask! You may email me at townmanager@cscia.org with any questions, concerns, complaints and compliments! Everyone of this year's attendants returned from last year!

Taking on a summer construction project? Be sure to always refer to the CSCIA Building Code at CSCIA.org before planning or starting a project. As required, all build requests should be forwarded to the Building Committee for covenant compliance review. Submittal directions and forms are readily available on the CSCIA.org website. Please submit any requests at least 30 days prior to any scheduled work!

Did you know? Use of any temporary storage container on your property is limited to 60 days. All vehicles, trailers and boats on your property must be properly tagged and/or currently registered. Commercial vehicles of 10,000 pounds or more can not be parked in a residential area. If you have any questions, please call the CSCIA Office, we're here for you!

Board In Brief CONTINUED

OLD BUSINESS

Gov. Breeden explained issues with the beach projects. The permit for mitigation at Lake Claire when Deep Creek marina was to be dredged was still open after that plan was postponed because county equipment could not do our part of the dredge. That permit was rescinded to allow the current permit application to be processed. The Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE) wants to delay processing it until Nov. The contractor for the Little Magothy dredge says that timing will not work because of time of year concessions. If the permitting cannot be done in time, the sand will go elsewhere. Our permit will be open on receipt of other sand for three years. Gov. Breeden will push for the review to be done sooner. He is in discussions with the county DPW to repair/extend the stormwater outfall at the main beach. Alliance for the Chesapeake is working on final contracts for using the grants awarded for design at the other sites.

Pres. Zadera said the county auditors accepted the 2024 financial reports and the revised 2026 budget form.

He reported that the attorney is reviewing agreements with the shopping center Business Lot Owners Association (BLOA), Cape Pool and CSCIA. A memorandum of understanding between all parties involved will be drafted so that each entity understands its rights and responsibilities moving forward with plans to address erosion behind the pool.

Pres. Zadera reported that Sunrise Tree Service replaced the plants damaged by the crew working next to Little Magothy beach.

NEW BUSINESS

Govs. Fairchild and Angel will represent CSCIA in the CSC Elementary School Escape Thru the Cape Fun Run.

CSCIA has signed as supporting Goshen Farm Preservation Society on a grant application with the Maryland Historical Trust and the African American Heritage Program to make improvements on the driveway and other capital projects.

There will be an AACo Government 2025 Community Association Summit on May 10.

A request was made to install a Little Library by the VP of the AA County Firefighters Assoc. It will be made from newspaper boxes and have a firefighter logo. A motion made to approve the request and find a place to have it installed passed unanimously.

COMMENTS

Charlie Corliss gave an update on Cape Vibes events. The first will be Mother's Day Music on May 11 from 2-6 pm. They would like to discuss having Cape Vibes T-shirts available at events for a suggested donation. Cape Vibes is reaching out to other Cape Recognized Organizations asking for participation at events. Cape Conservation Corps (CCC) will have a table at the Jun. 22 event.


Becky Benner announced that the Garden Club will hold planting parties in Apr. to prepare for the plant sale to be held May 17, 8am-2pm at the clubhouse field. They appreciate volunteers who come to help separate plants into pots and have openings on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays. There will be a preview sale at the May 5 meeting.

Mrs. Benner reported Goshen Farm will hold its spring Open House on Apr. 12 from 10am-2pm. There will be tours of the property, pony rides, artisans, music, etc. Admission is free. Hamburgers, hot dogs, pork and sides will be available. Goshen Farm meetings are held on Zoom. Go to goshenfarm.org and click on communications to be added to the Zoom invitation.

Stacey Wildberger of Cape Conservation Corps (CCC) announced that Rebecca Sawyer received her Girl Scouts Gold Award for her Little Learning Libraries. Mrs. Wildberger was proud and pleased to be her mentor. CCC is offering free trees to up to 25 people who complete the application on the capeconservationcorps.org website. Brad Knopf led 82 volunteers at a Project Clean Stream event on Apr. 1. They picked up over 1900 pounds of trash. Thanks go to Chris Ignaczak of Arundel Property Solutions for supplying a dumpster. The Conservation Crew kickoff event is on Apr. 9 at Little Magothy Beach from 6-8pm. CCC will have a table at the Goshen Farm Open House and will be on site at Lake Claire on Apr. 12 to support the Environmental Literacy capstone project by 2 BHS students. The native plant sale is on Apr. 19. Applications are being reviewed for the scholar-ship to be awarded to a BHS senior attending college in the fall and majoring in environmental sciences. The Broadneck Grill fundraiser night is Apr. 23. The Habitat Hero tour is scheduled for Jun. 5 from 5-7pm. Mrs. Wildberger asked about putting a bridge to the path at Little Magothy Beach. Gov. Macindoe will look into it. Permits may be necessary.

ADJOURNMENT

A motion was made to closed session and approved unanimously. The meeting was adjourned to a closed session at 8:39 pm. The closed session occurred from 8:45 pm to 9:24 pm. April 7, 2025, CSCIA Board of Governor's meeting was adjourned at 9:24 pm.



Mosquito Control

The annoying mosquito season is upon us and with that comes the annual spraying of pesticides by the county that our community uses to control/eliminate them, but not only does it not work, you are killing all the beneficial pollinators we are working so hard to attract to our yards. Insects that are needed for healthy ecosystems. Insects that support the life cycle of birds, which are in a dangerous population decline.

Mosquito spraying is a common public health strategy aimed at controlling the population of disease-carrying mosquitoes. However, it is important to note that not all mosquito species are effectively targeted by these spraying methods, particularly the Asian tiger mosquito (Aedes albopictus).

The Asian tiger mosquito is known for its distinctive black and white markings and aggressive daytime biting behavior. One of the challenges in controlling this species is that it often breeds in small, stagnant water sources, such as flowerpots, discarded tires, and bird baths, which may not be adequately addressed by aerial or ground spraying methods primarily designed for larger water bodies.

Furthermore, many insecticides used in mosquito control are designed to target specific life stages of mosquitoes, particularly the adult stage. Asian tiger mosquitoes may have different behavioral patterns that allow them to evade these treatments. For example, they often rest in shaded areas during the hottest parts of the day, reducing their exposure to sprayed insecticides.

Additionally, the effectiveness of spraying can be compromised by factors such as weather conditions, the presence of non-target species, and the development of insecticide resistance among mosquito populations. To effectively manage the Asian tiger mosquito, integrated pest management strategies that combine habitat reduction, targeted larvicides, and community education are essential. This multifaceted approach can help mitigate the risks posed by this resilient mosquito species while enhancing public health outcomes.

Asian tiger mosquitoes (Aedes albopictus) are primarily active during the daytime, particularly at dawn and dusk. They are known for their aggressive biting behavior, especially in shaded areas. While they can be found out at night, their activity levels typically decrease after sunset.

The effectiveness of spraying against Asian tiger mosquitoes at night is limited due to their lower activity during that time. To effectively manage them, strategies that focus on their daytime activity and breeding habitats are generally more effective. These strategies include EMPTY ALL STANDING water. Standing water is their breeding ground, even the smallest amount of water can be used.

- Empty corrugated drainpipes of water, draining them after a rain or installing a small window screening to keep them from entering and laying larva
- Use of Mosquito dunks in small ponds, bird baths and other necessary water sources
- Opt out of spraying so your yard does not get sprayed go on the Anne Arundel website for the form or stop by the CSCIA office to pick one up. The sprayers will not be allowed to spray within a 300-yard area of your property. Request for Exemption.pdf

PLEASE SHARE THIS INFORMATION WITH YOUR COMMUNITY

- Your Community's assigned fog night is: Monday.
 - Your community will only be fogged on Monday nights during the 2025 season.
 - If we need to fog on a different night due to mosquito borne illness, a press release will be issued and residents with exemptions will be notified.
- Fogging can occur anytime between 7:00 PM and 2:30 AM
- Fogging will not begin until 10 days after the community has been notified and we have received the Community Notification Verification Form
 - September 30 is the estimated last day of fogging for 2025
- Residents who do not wish their property to be fogged may file an exemption. The exemption policy and form can be found on our website: https://mda.maryland.gov/plants-pests/Documents/MosquitoControlExemptionForm.pdf
- Please stay indoors while fogging operations are being conducted
